GRAIN VARIABLE ON TRADE BOARD. Wheat, Corn and Oats Reach Top Prices, But Decline With Profit Taking

CHICAGO, Oct. 16 - Although wheat, corn and oats today reached some new top record prices for the season, immense profit taking sales led to downturns later. A decided gain in wheat values at Liverpool was chiefly responsible for the strength shown by markets here.

General buying sent wheat up quickly at the start here, but the rise, coming after other gains proved to be a great incentive to tin difficulties which tended to make speculative selling unpopular. failed to have a like effect on hedging, and the pressure from realizing here was noticeably increased through active selling from Winnipeg houses that were purchasing at home. Besides, increases in the domestic and Canadian visible supply totals served more or less to temper bullish sentiment.

Corn and oats were governed chiefly by the action of wheat. Leading interests reported that Germany was paying ninety-nine cents a bushel for corn at Rotterdam, equal to 76 in Chicago. Provisions, excepting only October lard, showed sympathy with the firmness of hog values.

Rail shares came to life today and some material gains were registered. Traders who have been bidding up stocks, in expectation of stock dividends, received a setback today when Elbert H. Gary, chairman of the United States Steel corporation and E. J. Corish, president of the National Lead company, both denied that any distribution was contemplated by their concerns.
