

BATES ADDRESSES LION CLUB HERE

District Governor is Honor Guest—C. W. Helme Introduced to Members

Lloyd Bates of Portland, district governor of the Lions' club, with part of Canada and all of Washington and Oregon under his jurisdiction, was an honored guest at the Salem Lions' club luncheon Friday noon.

"There are now more than 500 Lions' clubs in the United States and Canada," he declared, "and there will be 75 more before the international convention in June. To be a Lion means something big. It means service on a big scale. Little local questions can be handled by other organizations with shorter sighted vision. It is our business to find big things to do—and do them well. The need is for just such a national organization, with a big, fighting look into the things that need doing. It's all right to boost for our local community, but to boost intelligently we must lengthen our horizon, to the county, the state, the whole northwest, the whole Pacific coast, the nation, the world. We want to sell our ideas to the whole world. They must be good ideas, and they must be backed by Lions' power."

"L-I-O-N-S stands for Liberty, Intelligence, Our Nation's Safety. We have a chance to do something intelligent next Tuesday, election day. Every Lion ought to go and vote; vote his honest belief, vote intelligently as he sees the light, and get his friends also to vote. It is both a duty and a privilege to be a good citizen. Let's do it. And it is better as Lions to do one job well than to fiddle along on half a dozen good things and let them die or mould on our hands. Let's be Lions and fear nothing."

C. W. Helme, also of Portland, was introduced, to speak briefly of a tour he recently took of the south as far as New Orleans. He hadn't been much of a Lion before going, but he found them doing so many fine, big, American things on his trip—carrying hospital drives, helping in so many unselfish public enterprises that took both time and money and enthusiasm—that he comes back one of the fountain's Lions out of captivity.

Miss Elizabeth Levy, popular Salem violinist, delighted the club with two selections. A meeting of the board of directors of the club is to be held Monday evening at President Chastain's place of business, to take final steps in the Boy Scout drive.

State Land Board Turns Over Money to Treasury

For the month of October the state land board turned over to the state treasurer a total of \$161,849.11, according to G. S. Brown, clerk of the board. The items were:

Common school fund principal, payments on certificates and cash sales, \$13,115.16; common school fund principal, payments on loans, \$106,420.29; common school fund interest, payments on certificates, \$97.10; common school fund interest, payments on loans, \$36,214.40; university fund principal, payments on loans, \$450; university fund interest, payment on loans, \$366.22; agricultural college fund principal, payments on certificates and cash sales, \$60; agricultural college fund principal, payments on loans, \$1401.25; rural credits loan principal, \$157.39; rural credits loan interest, \$677.25; college interest on bonds, \$709.50. Total, \$161,849.11.

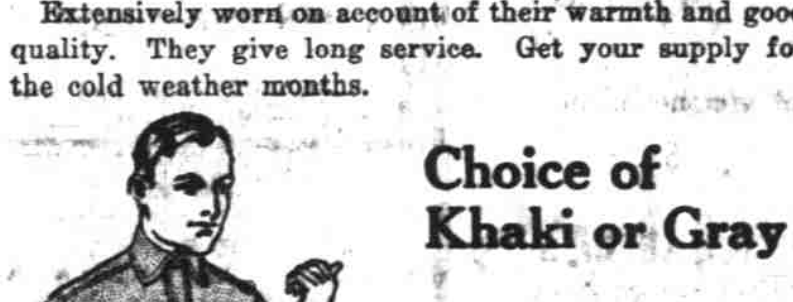
