The reason for the Secretary's action is found in a book on "British Statesmen of the Great War," in which Mr. Fortescue, the author, makes the following observations:

"Americans esteem a good bargain, even if gained by dishonorable means, to mark the highest form of ability. The United States cannot engage in any form of competition with us, from athletics to diplomacy, without using foul play. They must win, if not by fair skill, then by prearranged trickery or violence; if not by open negotiations, then by garbled maps and forged documents. There is the fact. 


