was attacked, but it remained unchanged. Debate Shut Off

There was little of the five minute debate which usually attends the consideration of important house bills. The ship bill leaders shut it off by motions.

Meeting an hour ahead of time tomorrow the house will plunge into the session relating to direct government aid to ships. The bill will come up for a vote on final passage Wednesday afternoon, after which the house will quit over Thanksgiving.
