THE GREATEST GOOSEBERRY DISTRICT

Some years back, gooseberries in the Salem district were glected to a greater extent than was good for the fruit industry as a whole, and to the overlooking of the profits that can be made in this branch of it-

But this will not be much longer a condition. The Salem canneries packed last season 7000 cases of gooseberries, 168,000 cans, or about 462,000 pounds-

And the acreage has been and is going out fast, so that this pack will mount up very rapidly from the coming season

And it should.

This should be so because the profits on gooseberries on ir own account are good and sure, and, moreover, because they mesh into the scheme of succession which is very imrtant for this fruit district; and still further because this is in the line of growers not putting all their eggs into one

And, still further, because there is no other locality in ie world so favorable to the production of the highest quality of gooseberries, with large average yields.

Gooseberries need no exploitation; the taste for them is iges old. In England great attention is given to gooseberry growing, and the gigantic jelly and jam business of that country revolves around the gooseberry, with markets ex-ending around the world; and they grow over 150 varieties cates. of gooseberries in that country.

The Oregon Champion gooseberry, grown here, is bound to make Salem the center of a great gooseberry industryled with the fact that our expanding fruit factories will nand more and more gooseberries and must have them, even at still prices, in ordr to build up a symmetrical line of products for their wide and ever growing markets.

So it transpires that there is sure money in gooseberries re: that they have been a bonanza crop some years for ne of our growers; and what is more important, are sure

o be continually a profitable crop.

Under most favorable conditions, gooseberries have elded here at the rate of 25,000 pounds to the acre, and reporter. sold in the early markets as high as 15 cents a pound, or at the rate of \$3750 an acre. Think of that as a bonanza
