

Girls' Dormitory Also Another important addition to the school, recently authorized by congress though the money is not available until July 1, is the new dormitory for the smaller girls. For this building, \$35,-000 was appropriated. The structure is to be of brick, two stories and basement. Superintendent Hall is of the impression that it might be arranged by the department to advertise for bids and let a contract before the money is actually available, and let the contractor arrange to finance the construction until July, when the federal money becomes available. This would allow the building to be finished in time for use for the fall term of school, when will be sorely needed.


