Public Accidents Included - The service is not restricted to workers disabled in industry. Workers disabled by public accidents or disease are equally eligible for training. For the year 1921-22 there was 7708 cases which originated in public accidents and 3049 cases which originated in disease.

CRIPPLES GET FEDERAL AID

Rapid Development of Rehabilitation Service for Workers Reported - WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—Rapid development in the federal-state rehabilitation service for workers disabled in industry or otherwise during the fiscal year 1921-22, was reported today by Harry L. Fidler, vice chairman of the federal board for vocational education, the report showing 15,467 new cases registered during the year ending June 30, 1922. This compares with a registration for 1920-21 of only 3893. Workers rehabilitated during the year numbered 1890, as compared with 457 rehabilitated in 1920-21. On June 30, 1922, the number of live cases on the rolls of the service approximated \$147.
