

'HEARTS AFLAME' GOOD PICTURE

Likeness Which Bears Strangely on Oregon Legislature Is Seen.

A picture that bears strangely on the recent Oregon legislature, is being shown at the Oregon from Saturday until Tuesday night. The screen title is "Hearts Aflame," but it was published almost two years ago as a serial in Everybody's Magazine, under the name of "Parakee's Folly." It depicts the struggle of a dreaming forester to save 10,000 acres of once logged-over but now splendidly reforested pine timber.

The piece has a thrilling enough sentimental plot, but the big story is the study of reforestation. A bill recently passed by the Oregon legislature provided for the reforestation of taxes on restored or growing timber, taxing only the land until the timber is ready for market. Governor Pierce vetoed the measure, after the legislature adjourned, on the general ground of public policy. In the story, they had been given a chance to reforest without destructive taxes until the jealous land shark political boss got the assessor's ear and started in to destroy the work of 50 years. The tax commission, appointed two years ago, recommended that the state be allowed to receive cut-over timber lands as gifts for the purpose of reforestation. The legislature killed it, and now the state will have to steal or buy any timber lands it wishes to own. That these two big problems should be so well forecasted in a story written two years ago, is of interest.

The horrors of timber fires such as have devastated Oregon in past years, are quite graphically shown in this picture; it's a powerful warning to the state, just at the beginning of the new fire season. The legislature appropriated \$85,000 for fire fighting and the timber companies and the government make the total sum spent in the state run up into the hundreds of thousands yearly. This picture is a free state campaign against the careless smoker and the firebug and the ruthless tree-killer who doesn't replant.


