CHURCHES PLAN FOR EASTER TIDE

Special Musical Programs Being Prepared—Special Services Arranged.

Today is Passion Sunday and next Sunday Palm Sunday. The approach of the Easter season is reflected in the different churches most of which are planning special musical programs for that occasion. Special services will be held during the week preceding Easter in one of the downtown halls under the direction of the Ministerial association.

A special series of sermons on the general theme, "Ascent to Easter" will be begun today by Rev. Blaine E. Kirkpatrick, at the First Methodist church.

The Presbyterian church will hold a series of pre-Easter prayer meetings during the coming week at the homes of members.

Special musical programs are being prepared by the different churches and the second annual music week in Salem will begin on Easter Sunday. The first day will be given over almost entirely to church music.

The sermon today at the Unitarian church will be "Jesus, Mary and Joseph." Mrs. Ferguson will sing special numbers including an aria from the oratorio, Messiah, "He Was Despised."

Sermon topics at the First Baptist church will be "Making Shipwreck of Faith" and in the evening "The Purpose and Motive of Christianity." "The Christian's Christ" will be morning topic at the Court Street Christian church and in the evening "The God of This World."

"Manhood's Morning" will be the subject of the sermon this morning at the Presbyterian church and this evening the topic will be "Making the World Better."

Revival services will begin at the Castle Street United Brethren church a week from today while the revival at the Twelfth and Mission street church of the United Brethren will continue during the coming week.
