

GROWERS PROTEST SAN JOSE RATE

Prune Discrimination Will be Fought by Cooperative Association

The Oregon Growers Cooperative association is charging unfair discrimination in favor of San Jose, Cal., and against Salem, since an announcement of the transcontinental freight bureau that the San Jose rate on prunes to Regina is \$1.63, and from Salem to Regina \$1.65. The association, it is said, will make a fight on the rate. The new rate is to become effective May 10. It is charged that powerful California interests have maneuvered to obtain the rate. The Oregon Growers have taken the case up with the public service commission.

At the offices of the Oregon commission yesterday it was pointed out that the San Jose rate is made possible by the use of steamer service from San Francisco to Vancouver. The all-rail rate has been \$1.50 from San Jose, as against \$1.65 from Salem. From San Francisco to Winnipeg and from Salem to Winnipeg the rate is \$1.54 from each point. The Regina rate, however, is more important to this district. Last year 35 carloads of prunes were shipped from here to Winnipeg and it is said the western Canada demand for Oregon prunes is constantly growing.

Polk Fruit Growers are Fearful of Frosty Nights

DALLAS, Or., April 13.—Special to The Statesman.—Polk county fruit growers are becoming worried about the continued frosts of the past several days and many are of the belief that the fruit trees which are out in blossom will be seriously damaged. The prunes will be out in blossom within a week and fears are entertained that the heavy frosts may injure the blossoms to such an extent that the crop will be materially cut down this year. Cherry trees and some peach trees have been out in full bloom for the past week and with favorable weather conditions this spring a bumper crop of these two fruits is expected.

Professor Dubach Will Talk to Six O'Clock Club

Professor U. G. Dubach of OAC, who is to be in Salem this summer as an "exchange professor," for the Willamette summer school, is promised for an address at the Six O'Clock club at the First Methodist church, Monday night, April 15. He made a long tour of South America recently, and comes home with a wonderful story of that brother land that has come so close to bringing the United States to war with Europe on various occasions since the Monroe doctrine was promulgated. Professor Dubach is rated as a very unusual speaker, with a wonderful story to tell, and his coming is considered a real event in the club history. At Corvallis, his home town, when he gave the same lecture under similar conditions, the hall was crowded, and many were turned away for lack of room.

Professor Dubach and Professor C. L. Sherman of Willamette are exchanging work in the two summer schools for this summer. Both schools open on June 18 and run for two six-week terms.

Floyd Johnson-Fulton Controversy Unsettled

NEW YORK, April 13.—The New York and New Jersey boxing commissions this afternoon failed to reach an agreement in the controversy over the Floyd Johnson-Fred Fulton heavyweight match, scheduled in Jersey City next Monday. William Muldoon, chairman of the New York body, of a conference insisted that the fight be postponed until after Johnson's contest with Jess Willard at the Yankee stadium on May 12, and it was announced that Newton A. K. Bugbee, New Jersey commissioner, had taken the suggestion under consideration.

Children are children the world over and the little Chinese in "East is West" will win the heart of any spectator.
