

### MORE MARRIAGES IN CULT OSCUR

#### House of David Celebrates Wedding of Couples Once Denied License

ST. JOSEPH, Mich., Walter Nelson, Detroit attorney who is suing and being sued by the House of David, refused today to furnish to the grand jury investigating the cult the names and addresses of girls who are said to claim they were criminally assaulted by "King" Benjamin Purcell, head of the colony.

Nelson, who represented Mr. and Mrs. John Hansell in their \$50,000 suit against the cult in federal court at Grand Rapids last week, is attorney for the Bamford sisters, who are suing Purcell for \$100,000 each for alleged improper relations, and is also defendant in a \$150,000 slander suit brought by the House of David.

Nelson told the grand jury that the names and addresses came to him from clients and were therefore not privileged to communications.

Judge Diagan adjourned the hearing this afternoon until Tuesday, after issuing more than a half a hundred subpoenas for additional witnesses.

Two more marriages were celebrated by the colony today when two couples who were refused marriage licenses Wednesday by order of Attorney General Andrew Daugherty succeeded in obtaining the papers.

one demand, that of release of political prisoners. Sawmills in this vicinity have not been affected as yet.

MISSOULA, Mont., April 27.—Managers of lumber camps in western Montana tonight declared that, as far as western Montana is concerned, the IWW strike is a failure. The manager of the Associated Mining company's lumber department declared that no men had left from his camps in response to the IWW call. The manager of the Polley company declared none of his men had left.

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., April 27.—Industrial Workers of the World who quit in lumber camps in this district this week were reported today to be planning on returning to work Monday. Logging and saw mill operations have not been seriously crippled by the walkout of about 300 loggers.

QUINCY, Cal., April 27.—Scattered strikers of IWW were reported today from remote sections of Plumas county where lumber operations have been carried on with only a few men. For the most part, however, the number of strikers has been reported as small, and enough workers have remained in camps and mills to protect property.

### Strike Fizzle

PORTLAND, April 27.—Reports received today from centers of the lumber industry in Oregon indicate the IWW strike has failed to come off so far as this state is concerned. In camps and mills where Loyal Legion of Loggers and Lumbermen membership also maintained by operators and employes, not one man has quit. It was declared by the legion officers.

### WOMEN HELD DENY CRIME CONNECTION

#### Suspects Held at Honduras Disclaim Knowledge of Clara Phillips

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras, April 27.—(By The Associated Press.)—The two American women, described by the police as Clara Phillips, California "hammer murderer," and Mrs. Young who are being held by the Tegucigalpa police on request of the California authorities, received in their cells today a number of Latin-American newspapermen.

Both women disclaimed any connection with the killing of Alberta Meadows in Los Angeles and expressed vehemently their disgust at being held in connection with the escape of Clara Phillips from the Los Angeles jail after conviction of the murder. They said they were residents of New York.

The woman who is said to be Clara Phillips asserts she is Mrs. Carson. Mrs. Young said she was a sister of Mrs. Carson. They refused to say anything further in regard to their arrest or the California murder case.

The man named Carson, who accompanied the women to Tegucigalpa and who likewise is being detained by the authorities, also was seen by newspapermen. He said he married in 1913 the woman who the police say is Clara Phillips.
