

CHERRY CROP WILL BE BIG

A. C. Raas Predicts Heavier Purchase From Salem Than Last Year

Predictions of a bumper cherry crop for 1924 as a result of his studies of the situation over a period of a great many years were made yesterday by A. C. Raas, of the Lyons California-Glad Fruit company, who has moved his packing station to the old "Bookhouse" Pacific wool warehouse, one half block west of the Marion hotel.

That the fruit crops move in cycles is the opinion of Mr. Raas, who bases his conclusions for the coming year on the fact that short crops have occurred both last year and this.

Veteran Buyer Here
"For 25 years I have been buying cherries in Salem," Mr. Raas declared, "purchasing more and more each year. We started to receive our first cherries yesterday, but it will be three or four days yet before the real work begins. Already 1500 barrels have arrived in the city for our use. We shipped 38 carloads last year, and expect to even increase this amount this season.

"Contrary to circulated reports that I would not be in Salem to buy cherries this year, I am still in the market for fruit in an unlimited quantity. The small grower and the large, whether the quantity is 10 pounds or 10 tons, will be received with an equal amount of attention. The grower is entitled to every consideration, for it is through the grower that Salem has been built."

Golden Rule Used
Among the many things of which he is proud, Mr. Raas is a hearty and sincere advocate of the "Golden Rule" in business. He declares that ever since the firm has been established in 1893, this has been their policy. Mr. Raas seldom makes contracts, for he says: "If your word is no good, then your contract is no good." He is also proud of the fact that his word is received with the same degree of confidence that a contract would be. The fact that he always pays cash to the grower is another point upon which he not only takes a great amount of pride, but which he emphasizes. Mr. Raas has instructed his field men never to make promises which they may be unable to fulfill, and to have it understood that a "no" is absolutely negative, while a "yes" is a guarantee.

Good in California
There is no fine land surrounding Salem as there is in the Santa Clara valley in California, and Salem should have as large a population as San Jose, were state agents made by Mr. Raas. Mr. Raas stated they were in the market, paying top prices, "spot cash," for unlimited quantities of Royal Anne, Waterhouse and Royal Anne seedling cherries this year.

STATEMENT WOULD CLEAR WRIGLEY

Owners of Seattle Baseball Club Say Chewing Gum Man Not Interested

LOS ANGELES, June 13.—William Wrigley, Jr., chewing gum magnate and stockholder in the Los Angeles club of the Pacific coast baseball league, does not own an interest in the Seattle club of the league, recently purchased by Wade Kilmer and Charles Lockard, but did assist them in obtaining \$125,000 from a Los Angeles bank to swing the deal, according to statements issued late today by Kilmer and Lockard.

In reviewing the history of the Seattle deal, in connection with which charges of "syndicate baseball" were made against

Wrigley by President William H. McCarthy of the coast league, and others, Lockard explains in his statement that he is making public the details of the transaction voluntarily, in order "to let the baseball world pass judgment."

Last March the statement asserts, Kilmer and Lockard, at that time, manager and business manager of the Angels, went to Wrigley, told him of their plans to purchase the Seattle club and asked him if he would assist them in obtaining cash to swing the deal. Wrigley is quoted as replying that he "would be glad to help in any way that he could," but that at no time did he want to have interest in any other baseball club than the Los Angeles club, and that he must not so arrange it that he would be held liable in any manner in connection with the purchase.

"As a result" the statement continues, "Mr. Kilmer and I borrowed the sum of \$125,000 from a Los Angeles bank, with Mr. Wrigley's aid, and with the understanding with the bank and Mr. Wrigley that our note should be retired at least within 29 days and another note and other security substituted therefor."

This substitution was made within 15 days, according to the statement and later a third note was accepted by the bank, bearing an endorsement, but secured by the Seattle club stock which Kilmer and Lockard had purchased.

Kilmer's statement covers similar ground and corroborates Lockard's version of the purchase. Joseph H. Patrick, president of the Los Angeles club, also issued a brief written statement today, pointing out that Wrigley is a

minority stockholder in the Los Angeles club, owning 6,000 shares out of a total of 25,000 and "owns no stock whatsoever in the Seattle club, has never owned any stock in that club, and has no financial or other interest in the Seattle club or its policies."
