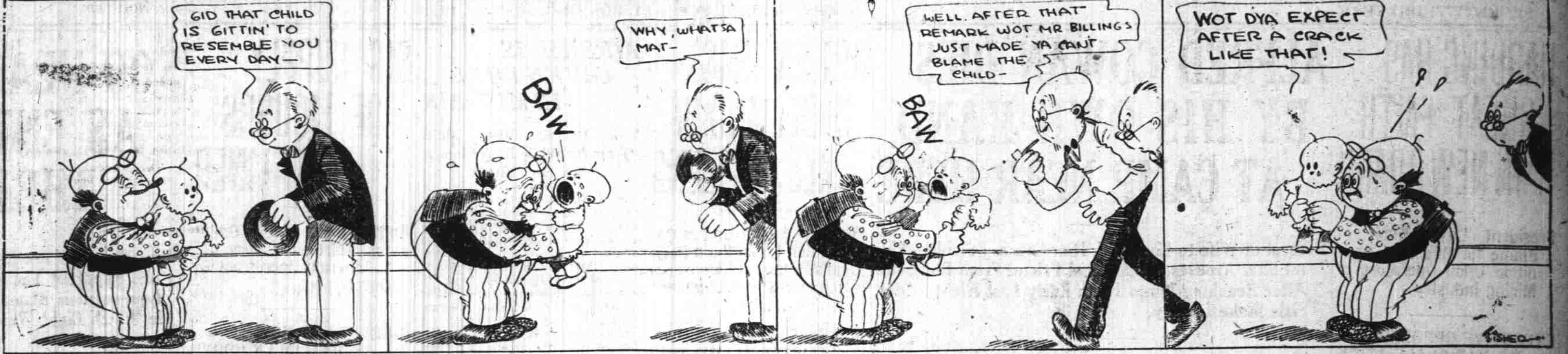

## ARTHUR PAULSON FATALLY INJURED

Portland-Salem Stage Driver Crushed Between Touring Car and Bus

OREGON CITY, Ore., June 25.—Arthur Paulson, 38-year-old Portland-Salem stage driver, died Sunday as a result of injuries received when he was caught between the stage and a large touring car. The stage was stopped at Barlow where a passenger, Miss Julia Sumaski, had just alighted. The driver was giving her baggage from the rear of the stage when the touring car in turning quickly to avoid a light car, pinned the stage driver between the stage and the touring car. Mr. Paulson pushed Miss Sumaski off the pavement to save her as the car struck him and she was only slightly bruised. Paulson is survived by his mother and sister at 740 East Twenty-first street, Portland.

Arthur Paulson, who was killed Sunday, was well known in Salem. As a driver of the Salem-Portland stage he was well known and liked by those who knew him here.
