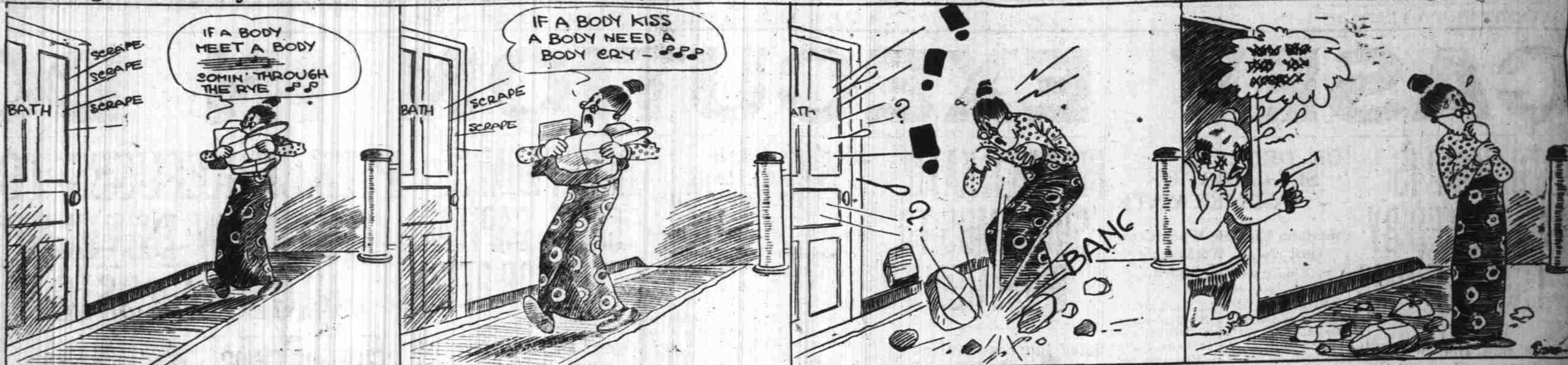

Josephine County Sends
In Annual School Report

The total cost of the schools of Josephine county during the school year ending in June, 1923, was \$171,453, as shown by the annual report of Alice Bacon, county school superintendent, filed with the state department of education. Of this total \$104,562 was paid for teachers salaries.

The report shows that there are 100 teachers in the county, 99 of whom are women. The enrollment of pupils in both grade and high schools was 2021, a slight increase over the enrollment of the previous year. Stand-

ard four-year high schools are maintained at Grants Pass, Hugo and Kerby. The percentage of attendance for the year was 95.7.
