AMATEUR ATHLETES OF DENMARK TO VISIT U. S.

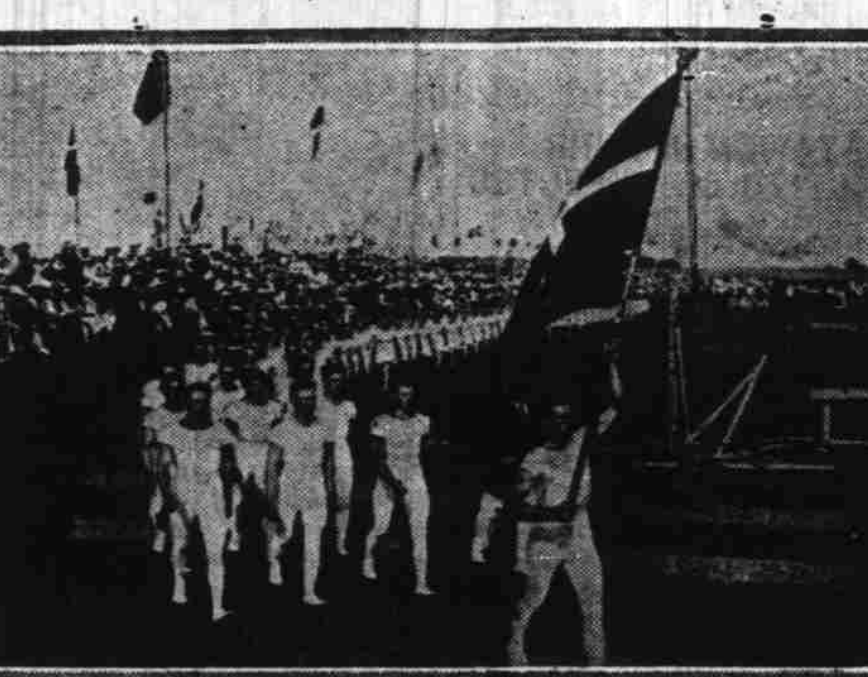
