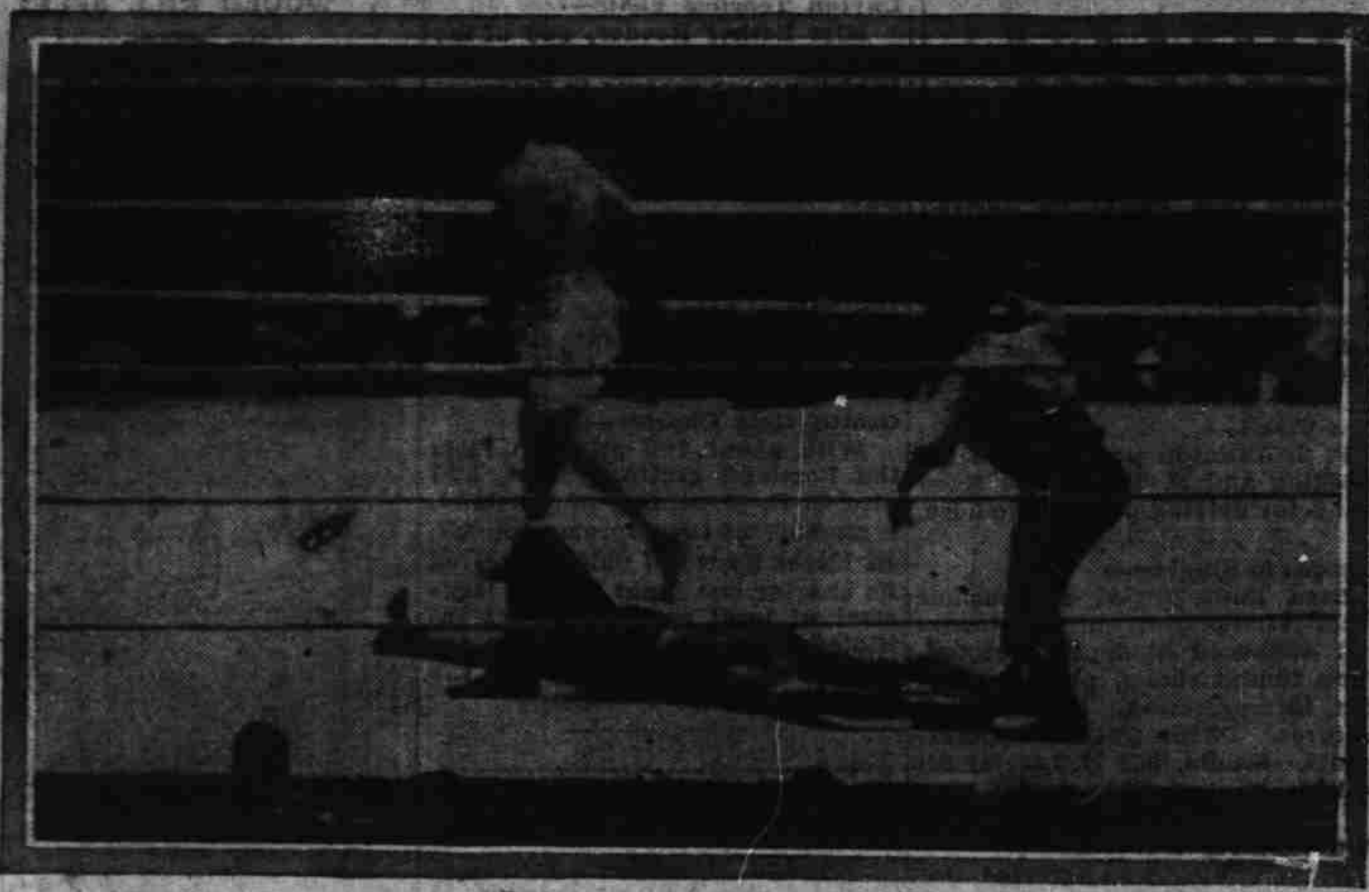
In addition to the note burning there will be three minute talks from the directors when each will be asked to tell briefly what his department has been doing.

POSITIVE EVIDENCE WILL BE DEMANDED

Papyrus, With Colors of Great Britain Arrives on American Soil

BERLIN, Sept. 29.—(By The Associated Press.)—Parliamentary leaders believe that Chancellor Stresemann's ability to keep the coalition intact depends wholly on the measure and promptness with which he succeeds in getting Germany's foreign affairs disentangled, now that he has made an

unconditional surrender of positive resistance. Unless the chancellor is in a position to appear before the Reichstag next Tuesday with positive proof that an early conclusion of the formal negotiations will be vouchsafed him, and that the question of Germany's responsibility in the Ruhr will also receive speedy clarification, his position, in the opinion of some of the leaders is likely to become one of awkward defenses.

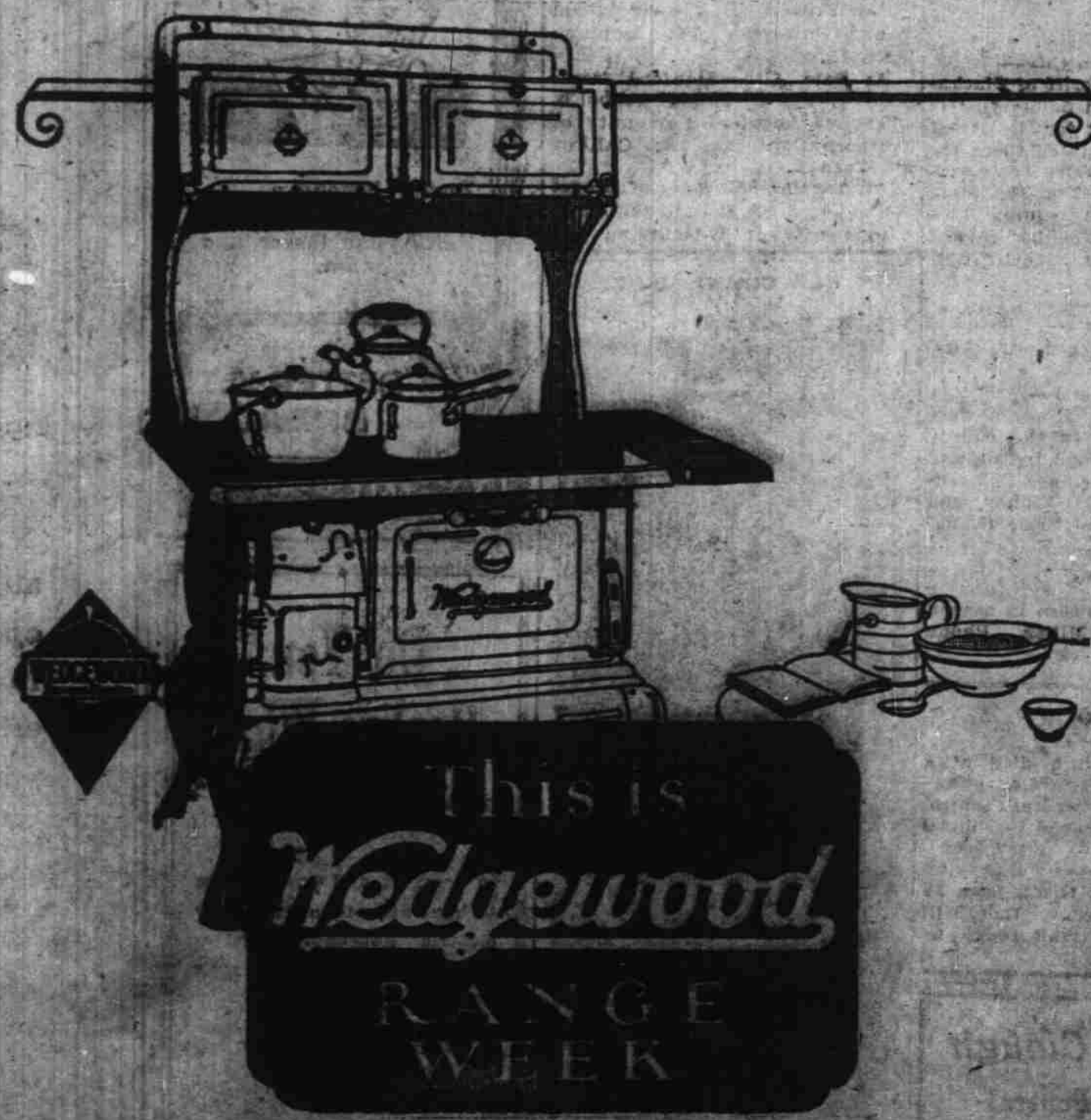
