## THOS. F. RYAN DIES SUDDENLY

Former Assistant State Treasurer and Clackamas Senator Passes

OREGON CITY, Oct. 20.—Thomas Franklin Ryan, financier and politician of Clackamas county and a familiar figure at public gatherings in Oregon for many years, died at his home here early yesterday morning. Except for a slight attack of what appeared to be indigestion last Saturday, he had appeared to be in his usual robust health, and was at his office in the Bank of Commerce attending to his duties as usual.

Judge Ryan was born in Newport, R. I., about 56 years ago, and came to Oregon in 1883, settling at Oregon City. He immediately entered Oregon political life, and since that time has been almost constantly in the public service in some capacity, aside from devoting himself to banking and investments. For eight years he was deputy state treasurer, and he also served in the state senate and lower house. He earned his title of judge, by which he was familiarly known, when he was elected county judge of Clackamas county. He also served as mayor of Oregon City for several terms and held other public offices as well. At the time of his death he was president of the Bank of Commerce here.

He was an extremely popular man, and was a member of many fraternal orders. He attained many of the higher degrees of Masonry and was also a member of the Elks, Odd Fellows, Knights of Pythias and other orders.

Funeral services for Judge Thomas F. Ryan will be held from the Odd Fellows hall, Oregon City, at 2 o'clock Monday.
