CHARACTER IS SKETCHED

Norma Marrs Describes an Oregon Celebrity and Recounts Work

Singing to pictures characterizes the work of Anthony Euwer, who read poems of the Oregon country to a generously applauding audience in the assembly room of the library. While he stood quietly, gesturing very little, his delivery was forceful and clearly enunciated.

"In every country there is a symbol that comes to us when we think of that country," said Mr. Euwer. "When we think of Egypt, we think of pyramids. Holland is the land of windmills. The Oregon country brings to mind, when it is mentioned, snow-capped mountains."

"The Want-Ad of My Soul" is his modern way in writing a

prayer, said Dean M. Ellwood Smith, dean of the school of basic arts and sciences, who introduced the entertainer.

Mr. Euwer came to Oregon for the first time in 1912. Since that time he commuted between New York City and the Oregon country, his present home being in Portland. His wife is a sister of Martin Ferguson Osborne, formerly head of the household science department at the college.

Mr. Euwer was a student at Princeton in the class of 1898. Chautauqua work, as a lecturer, entertainer, illustrator and rhymester occupied his time in 1919-1920.

"Besides the beautiful girls and those splendid men, your beautiful campus impresses me most," said Mr. Euwer, when asked his most striking observation while here.

Contrary to the usual appearance of poets, Mr. Euwer looks like the ordinary business man of today. He is of medium height, and fairly heavy set. While in the city Mr. Euwer was entertained at the home of Dr. J. B. Horner, director of Oregon historical research.

"When nothin' else is crowdin' him Nor pressin' on his mind, an' Jim is feelin' fairly fit and prime— But when it comes to that there time I guess it's not too much to say That Jim will have one busy day."

forces lost slightly under 33 per cent. The only difference between the two struggles was the implements of warfare which had improved and there were more instruments of destruction. "No single nation can, in any fairness, claim to have won the victory in the World war. There were sacrifices made by all and there is glory sufficient for all."

Citizenship Enlarged

"Though the war ended five years ago the duties of citizenship have enlarged. Preserve all that was won. These duties have been performed so far and let us remember this flag represents the finest type of free government ever framed by human minds."

Here the speaker turned and addressed his next remarks directly to the flag. "This symbolizes the accomplishments of the past, the duties of the present and the obligations of the future," he said. "When we salute it we salute our country; when we strive for it, we strive for our country."

Who and what the Unknown Soldier was before going into the service was commented upon, but no matter what his origin, race, political, financial status or religion, the speaker said, he personifies the spirit of America.

In closing Justice Harris told ex-service men that the welfare of the republic rests upon them as they proved themselves physically and mentally alert.

Griffith Presides

George P. Griffith, commander of Capital Post No. 9, presided at the meeting. He urged all to recall the idealism that was held five years ago, saying they were service men then and are service men still. Armistice day is a day of re-consecration, he said. Commemorate it.
