Use of Pullets as Breeders Year After Not Good. Says High Authority

The hatching results for the eason of 1923 were rather poor throughout most parts of the United States. There are doubt-less a number of contributing causes, and, according to Dr. M. graphs sewing machines, sheet emais, and piano studies. Repairing phonographs and sewing machines; 432 denortment of agriculture the causes of poor hatches has been the use from year to year of pullets as breeders. In a hatchability of eggs depends upon the constitutional vigor of the breeding stock producing the eggs. If the breeders are healthy and vigorous and are kept in comfortable quarters, the eggs should hatch well, providing the methods of incubation have been satisfactory. The use of pullets as breeders may affect this situation in the following manner: The practice of using pullets as breeders frequently leads to the use of immature birds.
