Oregon State News

Rapid Progress Being Made on New S. P. Line

Contracts for construction work on the third unit of the Southern Pacific company's new main line in Oregon, between Klamath Falls and Eugene has been let to the Utah Construction Company of Ogden and San Francisco and the Stewart & Welch company of Seattle and San Francisco.

The contracts provide for 32 miles of roadbed and include the building of a 3700 foot tunnel under the summit of the Cascade Range, it was stated by George W. Boschke, chief engineer of the Southern Pacific, in making the announcement today.

Timber Track Sold.
ROSEBURG, Dec. 31.—The timber sale at the federal land office aroused little competition this morning although all the timber was sold. Three million feet went to various lumber companies for a total of \$78,000. Buyers for timber concerns from all over the state took the timber at the appraised government value. The timber was located in Douglas, Coos and Lane counties in some of the heavy forest districts. The original applicants for the lands with timber on it bought for their companies and much interest was shown in the sale.

Fred W. Bradley, of Bay City, Michigan, bought over fourteen thousand dollars' worth for himself. Eastern capital was thus interested in timber in this section. The timber which Mr. Bradley purchased lies mostly in Lane county. Other purchases were made chiefly by Oregon lumber firms, a good portion going to Portland companies and the Coos Bay Lumber company.

Waterfront Area Sold.
ASTORIA, Ore., Dec. 23.—R. A. Wickersham, Pasadena, has purchased 200 feet of waterfront to a depth of 1400 feet on Young's bay here, adjoining a similar piece which he already holds. Consideration was given to the \$100,000. What the tract will be used for is not known here.

No Flood in Schools.
EUGENE, Dec. 31.—No more will students of the Eugene high school look with anticipation on the coming of high water in the Amazon, the flooding of the school basement, and the dismissal of classes as a result. A new pump has been installed and from now on the floods can come anytime and the school will continue to function through the worst of it, according to O. H. Jones, clerk.

A shutoff plug has been provided for the sewer outlet and a siphon pump to keep the sewage out of the boiler pit. The improvement has been made at a total cost of \$45 and will prevent any recurrence of the closing of the school which has been an annual event at times of high water since the building was erected several years ago.

MARSHFIELD, Dec. 31.—Work on a new electric power plant to cost between \$800,000 and \$750,000 to be located near the gas plant between Marshfield and North Bend will be started shortly after the first of the year by the Mountain States Power company, according to notification received today by A. L. Martin, local manager for the company.

The first unit of the plant will be a \$5,000 kilowatt generator which should be in operation inside of 10 months. Mr. Martin said. While the foundations of
