Silverton Hopes to Be Nut Center Some Time

SILVERTON, Ore., Jan. 4.—(Special to The Statesman.)—That the hills surrounding Silverton, and perhaps more especially the Waldo hills, will some day become a nut center is a fact fast being realized by the hill farmers. Already a great number have planted small acreages of filbert and walnut trees. J. J. Doerfler is perhaps doing the most extensive nut farming at the present time. Last year he planted six acres evenly divided between walnuts and filberts. To this he added this year 100 more walnut trees. Mr. Doerfler says that within four or five years he expects to have a nut acreage somewhere close to 40 acres.

Mr. Doerfler also claims that nuts and grain are not the only crops which can be grown successfully in the Waldo hills. He reports that with plenty of lime alfalfa can also be made a successful crop.

Bill Hayward is Chosen For Olympic Coaching Staff
EUGENE, Or., Jan. 4.—William (Bill) L. Hayward, for over 20 years track coach and trainer for the University of Oregon, has been invited to become a member of the coaching staff for the United States Olympic team, he announced today. The invitation comes from William C. Prout, president of the American Athletic Union, and Mr. Hayward has accepted, pending approval by the international Olympic committee. Should this approval be given, Hayward will leave with the American team on June 17 for Paris.

In 1912 Hayward accompanied the team to Stockholm, and in 1920 to Antwerp. In 1920 he had charge of all athletics from the United States west of the Mississippi river.

Discrepancies in the various stories told of the shooting of Courtland S. Dines, Denver oil operator, New Year's night; contradictions in statements made by the several persons present in Dines' apartment when the shooting occurred; and unexplained circumstances, attending the affair, still stand out, three days later, in a case that is attracting almost as much attention as the unsolved mystery of who killed William Desmond Taylor, motion picture director here in February, 1922.

That Dines was shot
