SILVERTON, Ore., Jan. 4 .-(Special to The Statesman.)-That the hills surrounding Silverton, and perhaps more especially the Waldo hills, will some day be come a nut center is a fact fast being realized by the hill farmers. Already a great number have planted small acreages of filbert and walnut trees. J. J. Doerfler is perhaps doing the most extensive nut farming at the present time. Last year he planted six acres evenly divided between wal-\$365.00 nuts and filberts . To this he added this year 100 more walnut \$235.00 trees. Mr. Doerfler says that within four or five years he expects to have a nut acreage somewhere
