It is therefore ordered and adjudged by the Court that on and after Saturday, the twenty-second day of December, 1923, thence following and until May 1, 1924, all county roads of the County of Marion, State of Oregon, which are not paved with hard surface pavement, be subject to the following restriction and maximum load limitation, to-wit: No vehicle shall move over such county roads having a concentrated weight bearing upon the surface of the highway at contact with the wheels of any one axle thereof in excess of the following limit, to-wit: On any vehicle having a total entire tire width of 30 inches and more than 30 inches the concentrated weight bearing on the surface of the highway at contact with the tread of the two wheels of any one axle of such vehicle shall not exceed the product of the sum of the entire width of two wheels of such axle multiplied by 350.
