TAX SCHEDULES TO BE CONSIDERED

Ways and Means Committee Clears Way for Work on Mellon Bill

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.—While the house ways and means committee cleared the way today for consideration of the new tax rate schedules, the house majority leaders sounded out the administration and their party members for a possible compromise on the Mellon bill, particularly as regards the surtax rates.

Before calling a meeting of the majority members of the committee for tomorrow to map out a program for study of the new rates, chairman Green discussed the tax situation with President Coolidge and pointed out difficulties confronting adoption of the surtax rates proposed by Secretary Mellon.

Although Mr. Green later indicated no change in the administration's stand for majority leadership's stand for the major principles of the Mellon bill, Representative Longworth, majority leader, who announced he had conferred with the president and Secretary Mellon, reaffirmed his belief that a compromise on the surtax reductions was necessary.

GERMAN FINANCES ARE EXPLAINED

Dawes and Committee Members Listen to Talk and Ask Questions

(By The Associated Press)

PARIS, Jan. 21.—Dr. Schacht, president of the Reichsbank, gave a long explanation of German finances before the first committee of experts under Brigadier General Charles G. Dawes this afternoon. Dr. Schacht was accompanied by Dr. Mayer, head of the German reparations delegation in Paris, and for three hours answered questions which previously had been given to him and replied to inquiries of various members.

Dr. Schacht went over the entire currency problem and gave many statistics. He explained the different kinds of money in Germany and elaborated his views on how new currency could be put on a sound basis. Tomorrow he will appear before the second committee to give information regarding German exported capital.

Dr. Schacht was pledged to secrecy by the committee. The hearing accorded to Dr. Schacht by the committee took place in a most favorable atmosphere and the head of the Reichsbank answered most willingly all questions.

HIGHER PRICES ON CORN ASKED

Slight Upturn in Market Noticed on Board of Trade Yesterday

CHICAGO, Jan. 21.—Evidence multiplied today that farmers are holding out for higher prices on corn, largely as a result, something of an upturn in the corn market here took place and has a steadying effect on wheat and oats. Corn closed firm at the same as yesterday's finish to 3-8 @ 1-2 cent higher, May 78 1-2c with wheat unchanged to 1-8 1/4c lower; May 1.08 to 1.08 1-8 and July 1.06 5-8, oats varying from 1-4c off to 1-4c up and provisions unchanged to 10c higher.

Apparently next to no offerings of corn at any price were being made to Chicago at present and one of the largest handlers here admitted having failed to obtain a single carload since Friday last.

Missouri river points reported liberal receipts but this was ascribed to premiums, those markets were playing over Chicago and was regarded here as emphasizing the keen demand. Primary receipts, taken as a whole were still below the total a year ago and there was nothing to indicate an increase, especially as reports were received of a cold wave coming. The severe weather was expected to interfere with the movement of corn to accelerate feeding demand.

Instead of enlarging as usual at this time of year, the visible supply of corn today showed another decrease, leaving the total at 9,263,000 bushels, about 11,000,000 bushels less than last year, unfavorable financial conditions in parts of the northwest had a bearish effect on the wheat market. Otherwise, wheat tended to follow the leadership of corn in-

ARCHIE ROOSEVELT TELLS NEW STORY

Son of Former President Testifies Before Teapot Dome Committee

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.—Archie Roosevelt, son of former President Theodore Roosevelt, making an unheralded appearance today before the senate Teapot Dome investigating committee, declared the "amazing testimony" developed by the committee had been a contributing cause to his decision to sever his connection with the Sinclair interests.

Mr. Roosevelt testified, and was corroborated by his brother, Theodore, assistant secretary of the navy, that G. D. Wahlgberg, private secretary to Harry F. Sinclair, had told him that he had cancelled checks for \$68,000 drawn by Mr. Sinclair to the order of the foreman of the New Mexico ranch of Albert B. Fall, former secretary of the interior, who leased the Teapot dome naval oil reserve to the Sinclair interests. Mr. Wahlgberg closed pressed by members of the committee denied he had made any statement that he had the cancelled checks and declared emphatically and repeatedly that he had no knowledge of money or any other consideration having passed between Mr. Sinclair and Mr. Fall.

Archie and Theodore Roosevelt were recalled and reiterated their statements. Archie said he had talked with Wahlgberg over the telephone about 1:30 o'clock this morning, Theodore listening in and had obtained from Wahlgberg full confirmation of his understanding of their previous conversation in which he said Wahlgberg told him he had the cancelled checks.
