

CHARGES LODGED AGAINST FALLIN

Salem High School May Forfeit All Games Played This Season

With Grant Fallin, forward on the Salem high school basketball team out of the line-up, the red and black quintet left yesterday for Eugene to meet the purple and white tonight regardless of the fact that this and every other game played this season may be forfeited.

Though Fallin played only three games with the Falls City aggregation several years ago, this serves as the basis of contention that he has played in interscholastic circles for five years, and hence would not be eligible for high school athletics this season. Fallin was not aware that the participation in these three games would bar him this year. The entire matter has been placed in the hands of the board of control and no action will be taken until an answer is received.

If the charges, which were filed by Independence men are upheld, the district championship, which consists of defeating all other aspirants in Marion, Polk and Clackamas counties, may be forfeited by Salem and the team lose its opportunity to compete in the state championship tournament next month. Independence is claiming the right to represent the district as the result of Salem having played an ineligible player.
