sub-committee to draft the bill and predicted a report on the measure would be made to the house by the middle of next week. The sub-committee will use as a working basis the proposal made in committee by Representative Bacharach, republican, New Jersey, in framing the insurance clause. Under this suggestion provisions would be made for 30 year endowment policies payable at the age of 62 years with values figured at about \$2.65 for each day of service after the first 60 days. Whether veterans will be permitted to borrow on the policies has not been definitely settled, although sentiment of the committee is in favor of such an arrangement.

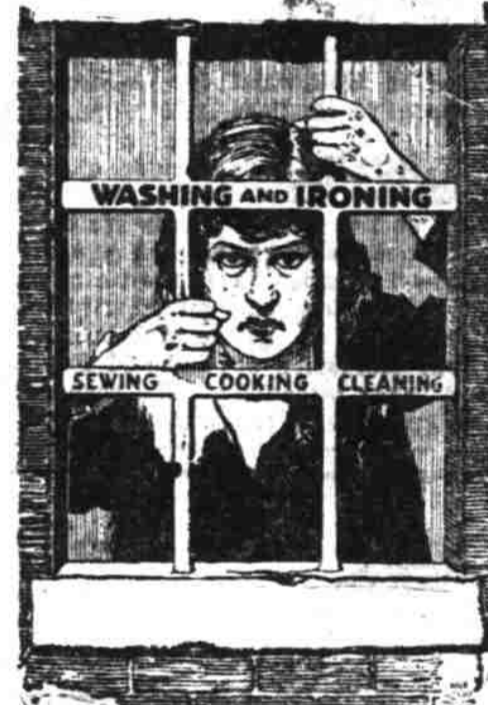
