

**Ballot Title Completed
On Parent-Teacher Bill**

Attorney General I. H. Van Winkle yesterday completed the ballot title for the bill being initiated by the Oregon Parent-Teacher Association, Inc., to remove the property qualification for electors in school elections. The persons who sign the measure are Gertrude T. Perkins, Portland, president; Jesse Dodge, Ashland, vice president; Mrs. F. B. Merry, Portland, corresponding secretary; U. G. Worrlow, Portland, recording secretary; and Mrs. Robert S. Huston, Eugene, treasurer. The ballot title says: "Purpose: To authorize any cit-

izen of this state, male or female, who is 21 years of age and has resided in the school district 30 days immediately preceding a meeting or election of such district to vote at such meeting or election without being a taxpayer in such district, or the head of a family having children of school age, which are now required for voting on other questions than the election of school officers."

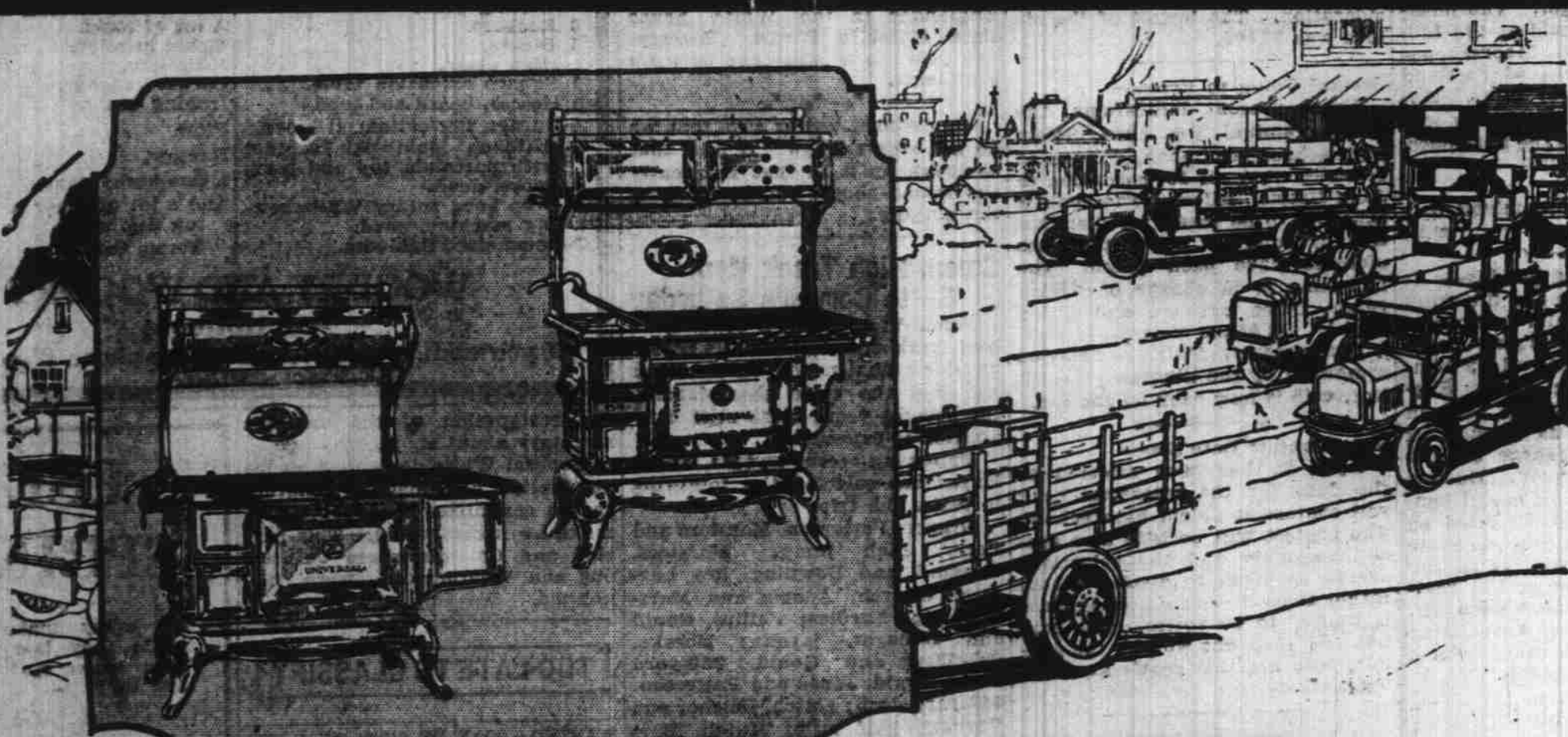
