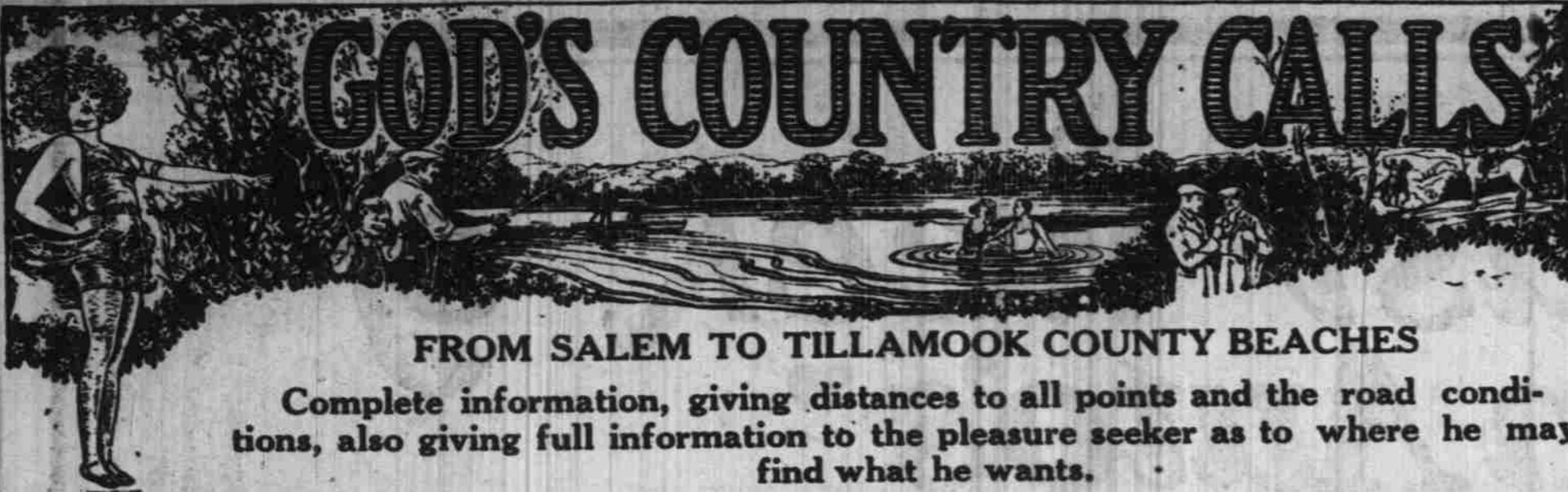


GOD'S COUNTRY CALLS



FROM SALEM TO TILLAMOOK COUNTY BEACHES

Complete information, giving distances to all points and the road conditions, also giving full information to the pleasure seeker as to where he may find what he wants.

LOG as registered by Statesman Scout, distances taken from speedometer readings. Leaving Salem from corner of Commercial and Chemeketa street and crossing the bridge that spans the Willamette river, entering Polk county and enjoying paved roads as you travel westward, you arrive at Rickreall, which is just 10 miles from Salem.

From Rickreall take the west side Pacific highway and travel north to Amity. This road is all paved with the exception of a quarter mile where the road crosses the Southern Pacific electric line. Amity is 23.4 miles from Salem. At Amity you have your choice of traveling 14 miles by pavement or 6.6 miles by gravel road to Bellevue. If you wish the pavement route, head straight north on the highway from Amity for 6 miles where a paved road forks to the left. Distance from Salem 29.6 miles. From here you travel west for 8 miles to Bellevue. If you wish to take the shorter but gravel road from Amity, turn west and you will find a fair gravel road which will lead you to Bellevue, which is just 30 miles from Salem. This is the more direct route and all distances from Salem to the coast will be figured by this route. From Bellevue to Sheridan a distance of 4.4 miles there is excellent pavement. On entering Sheridan you cannot help but note the sign: "You Name It—We Grow It." Sheridan is 34.4 miles from Salem.

At Sheridan you leave the pavement but there is an excellent gravel road to Willamina, a distance of nearly 5 miles. Willamina registers 39.3 miles by the speedometer from Salem.

Cross the Willamina river and after traveling about 6 1/2 miles you will come to a fork in the road. The main highway turns to the right here but those wishing to see New Grande Ronde should take the road straight ahead which joins the highway again in 3 miles and makes the total distance no further. Two miles from this fork of the road you will arrive at Grande Ronde which is 47.9 miles from Salem.

Going north from Grand Ronde 1 1/2 miles you will again be on the highway. This place is the Old Grande Ronde and is 49.3 miles from Salem.

After leaving Old Grande Ronde the road leads gradually upward through timber and over a well graded and well kept highway to the summit of the Coast range mountains which is 790 feet above

sea level. The summit is 57.7 miles from Salem. A few miles further and you enter Tillamook county and in less than another mile you arrive at Dolph which is 61 miles from Salem.

From Dolph to Hebo, a gradual downward grade, you will find good gravel roads. Hebo is 72 miles from Salem.

From Hebo you have your choice of traveling 14 miles by pavement or 6.6 miles by gravel road to Bellevue. If you wish the pavement route, head straight north on the highway from Amity for 6 miles where a paved road forks to the left. Distance from Salem 29.6 miles. From here you travel west for 8 miles to Bellevue. Two and one-half miles from Cloverdale take the right hand road, leaving the Roosevelt highway, for Pacific City. In a quarter of a mile from this point you will note a sign "Brooten's Baths," which is located off the Pacific City road about a mile and up quite a steep grade, but the road is all planked. Brooten Baths is 78.5 miles from Salem.

Going back to the Roosevelt highway 3.8 miles from Pacific City you again travel west and south for 8.2 miles and you arrive at Nesocwin, a new resort right on the ocean and 85.2 miles from Salem.

Arriving back at Hebo turn west on the highway and in 4.6 miles you will reach Beaver and pavement. Beaver is 76.6 miles from Salem.

If you want to reach the beaches west of Tillamook, turn west on Third street. The road is paved for two miles where you cross the Tillamook river. After crossing the bridge take the left hand road. There is good gravel road for 1 1/2 miles then 1 1/2 miles of plank road through some big timber. At a distance of 5.8 miles from Tillamook there is another fork in the road. Take the right hand road here. Two miles further and you arrive at Netarts, which is 100.7 miles from Salem or 7.7 miles from Tillamook.

Provisional Birth and Mortality Figures

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 24.—The Department of Commerce announces the birth rates for 1923 were lower than for 1922 in 21 of the 27 states for which figures for the two years are shown in the following summary. The highest 1923 birth rate (84.8 per 1,000 population) is shown for cities of Wyoming and the lowest (15.6) is for rural districts of Montana.

Death rates for 1923 were slightly higher than for 1922 in 25 of the 35 states shown for both years. Three states, Connecticut, New York and North Carolina, have the same rates for 1923 as for 1922 and eight states, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nebraska,

South Carolina, Utah, and Washington, have lower rates in 1923. The highest death rate (29.3 per population) is shown for cities of Mississippi and the lowest (6.5) for the rural districts of Idaho.

Infant mortality rates for 1923 are generally higher than those for 1922, as 17 of the 27 states show higher rates in 1923. The highest 1923 infant mortality rate (117) appears for cities of South Carolina and the lowest (51) for the rural districts of Utah and the cities of Washington. Infant mortality rates are shown for both years for 45 cities of 100,000 population or more in 1920. For 25 of these cities the 1923 infant mortality rates are lower than those of the previous year. The highest 1923 rate (110) is for Richmond and the lowest (48) for Spokane.

Why a Princess Wrote A Song for Springtime

HONOLULU, April 29.—The recent sale of a tract of beach land at Maunawili, on the windward side of the island of Oahu, has recalled the origin of a song that made known the haunting music of these islands to the rest of the world.

It was at this wonderful beach that the late queen Liliuokalani received the inspiration for Hawaii's best known song, "Aloha Oe," or "Farewell to Thee." She was then a princess, and visited Maunawili ranch with a party of the Hawaiian court. On the day of leaving all the visitors were decked with garlands of flowers. One of the men lingered behind to say goodbye to a girl who lived at the ranch. They walked apart down the beach; there was a kiss, and the princess witnessed the scene.

On the way back to Honolulu Liliuokalani persistently hummed a tune over and over again. She said a melody was going through her head, and she was seeking words for it. She was thinking of that leave-taking on the white sands of Maunawili. Near Honolulu the party rested, and the princess sang bits of the melody. The phrases in the chorus of "Aloha Oe," "one fond embrace," and "until we meet again," had their basis in the scene on the beach.

At the palace the princess wrote down the notes and the words, and the melody was later arranged by Henri Berger, master of the royal Hawaiian band.

OLDS AUTO GIVEN ENGINE TESTS

Public Asked by Manufacturers to Suggest Severe Tests; Response Great

Rivals of the Rocky mountains have been discovered in at least a score of different sections of the United States since the Olds Motor Works asked the public to suggest tests for the new Oldsmobile Six. The request has proven one thing—that automobilists desire a car that requires little gear shifting and one that will take any hill encountered.

"The Oldsmobile may have crossed the continent with all gears—first, second and reverse—except high removed, but I'd like to see it climb 'Whattit' hill."

That has been the gist of many statements made to Oldsmobile dealers throughout the country during the past week. Which proves that local hills and mountains are not without honor in their own countries.

Results of these local tests have surprised even seasoned automobile drivers, according to reports from Oldsmobile dealers. They have been astounded at what the

well-made automobiles of today can do if necessary. One of the most novel suggestions received tented the staming of every part of the car. To comply with the idea a "plank" road a city block long was built in a field. The heavy planks were laid diagonally, and to them were nailed joists ranging from two-by-four to four-by-four. These joists were laid at irregular intervals and at various angles to the road. An Oldsmobile was run over this "road" for eight hours, back and forth without stop. Each trip joined and twisted the car from end to end. At the conclusion the "suggestor" of the test had the car thoroughly examined, and found that no engine troubles, torsion strains, clutch or transmission difficulties or other troubles had developed.

Big Speculation in Pearls Caused by the Argentine
