SHOWERS BRING DROP IN WHEAT

General Prediction of Rain in Wheat Belt Checks Advance of Price

CHICAGO, June 6.—Wheat averaged lower in price today chiefly as a result of showers predicted for the greater part of the grain belt. Germany's acceptance of the Dawes plan, however, was a late bullish factor. The close for wheat was unsettled, ranging from $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ net decline to $\frac{1}{4}$ ¢ advance. July, $\$1.04\frac{1}{2}$ to $\$1.05\frac{1}{2}$, and September $\$1.05\frac{1}{2}$ to $\$1.06\frac{1}{2}$. Corn finished $\frac{1}{4}$ ¢ to $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ up, and oats unchanged to $\frac{1}{4}$ ¢ to $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ off. In provisions the outcome varied from $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ setback to a rise of 12¢.

Although the wheat market here started with an upward tendency due to an expected advance at Liverpool and to gossip that export bids for United States wheat had been somewhat raised, sellers were in a majority after the government forecast was issued pointing to widespread moist weather.

BREAKFASTS ARE VERY POPULAR

Some Hints for Women Who Like to Entertain Friends in Forenoon

BACKWARD SPRING HINDERS BUSINESS

Bradstreet's Says Retail Trade Good; Other Industry Lagging Behind

NEW YORK, June 6.—Bradstreet's tomorrow will say: "While warmer weather in a few states, mostly of the south, has made for slightly better crop progress and for a more cheerful trend of reports as to retail trade, the great majority of advices testify to the late backward spring, within most areas rainy weather still retarding retail trade, crop work and growth and building. In the northwestern quarter of the country dry weather is complained of, in many states, but accompanied here too by low temperatures. Hence, retail trade is now quite fair; and so, also, is jobbing and wholesale distribution. Industry, outside of building, tends to lag. Crop reports, owing to the late season, are not equal to a year ago. Measures of movement thus far available for May indicate a slight gain in clearings, but lessening in mail order trade reduced outputs of automobiles and pig iron, the sixth successive decline in commodity prices and increased failures and liabilities as compared with May a year ago."

TRADERS WEAKEN STOCK MARKET

NEW YORK, June 6.—Stock prices weakened perceptibly today under the persistent hammering of professional traders.

Encouraged by the success of a drive against the oil shares, based on a fresh cut in mid-continent crude oil prices, they extended their operations to other sections of the list, forcing sharp declines in steel, rubber, specialty issues.

The close of the day found 30 industrial stocks, including United States steel, were in new low ground for the year.

Ability of the bear element to depress prices in whatever sections of the list it launched its attacks, undermined speculative confidence and realizing developed toward the close in the rail and public utility groups, which had shown independent strength earlier in the day. Rail shares turned downward for the first time this week and gains which had carried several public utility issues to new 1924 high levels were canceled. With the recent forward movement in various rails and public utilities failing to stimulate much outside buying, there were indications that pool operations, presumably under way, were suspended late in the day when the supply of other stocks became too great for the market to absorb.
