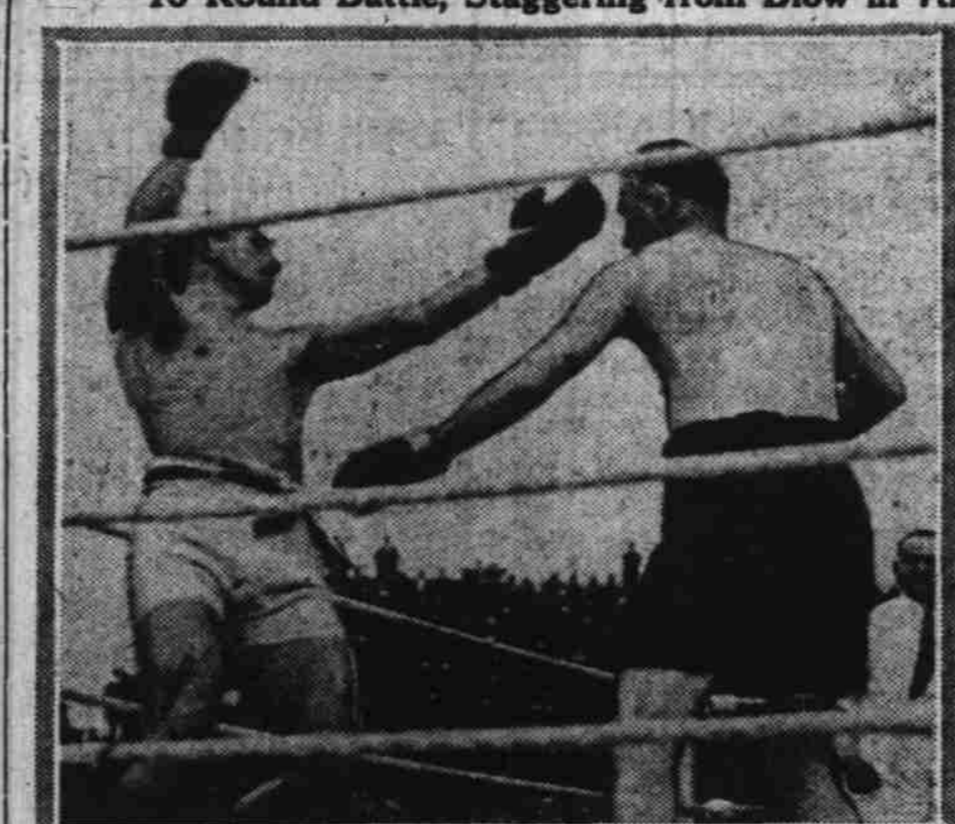
Philadelphia 7; Chicago 6
