

GLADYS MEDLER NAMED WINNER

Yesterday Afternoon Was
Doll Day at Lincoln School
Playgrounds

Interest in the Salem playgrounds, which was centered at the North 14th street location Friday night for the official opening, was transferred to the Lincoln playground in South Salem Saturday afternoon, when more than 100 youngsters, a majority of them girls, participated in a doll parade under the direction of Miss Danta Robbins, supervisor. Dolls were given the winners through the courtesy of the Miller Mercantile company, Kafoury Brothers and Woolworths.

With 48 entrants in the doll parade, the opening feature, Gladys Medler was accorded the winner. For the most beautiful doll, Martha Kleckenhaus received first and Bessie Newcomb second prize. Marion Shaw, 11, entered the oldest doll and Rose Rietter the most worn out doll. Gladys Medler was first in the doll buggy race and Margaret Hauser second.

The day was not entirely devoted to the girls, for various athletic events for the boys as well as the girls were staged. The bicycle race was won by Claude Martin, with Billie Yarnell second. Orville J. Marsh placed first in the sack race with Claude Martin second.

A girl's team, consisting of Doria McAllister and Iola Koop, defeated the boys team of William Trindle and Ray Rhoten in the three-legged race.

Several short foot races were also staged, Orville J. Marsh winning first and Marvin Humphreys second in the 50-yard dash for boys under 8 years and Margaret Hauser and Mary Baldinger first and second in the corresponding race for girls. In the dash for boys and girls between 8 and 13 years, old, Paul Brown was first and Ray Rhoten second in the first class and Margaret Pervola and Gladys Medler second in the dash for the girls.

An average attendance of 200 a day has been maintained at the playground in North Salem this week. Owing to the weather being a little cooler than the previous week, games have occupied a greater portion of the youngsters than have the water sports and the wading pool, which, however, have been liberally patronized.

Friday and Saturday saw the fewest number of youngsters on the grounds, a great many having accompanied their parents on trips over the week end.

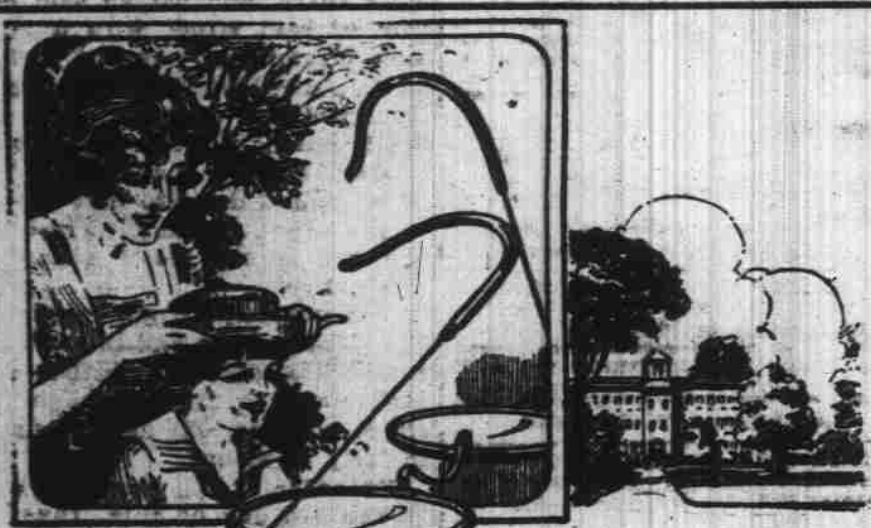
