The U. S. government has had for the past month eradicating cultivated black currant bushes. This is a measure taken for the white pine blister rust into the the counties to the north and west last summer and the work is to be continued in the other counties west of the Cascades as rap-

are subject to this disease but the cultivated black current is very of diseased pines as much as 150 miles away. This is not true of other currants or the gooseber-The disease does not pass from pine to pine.

In regions where the disease be comes prevalent and where it is desired to raise white pines commercially, local control measures are in force and in this case all currants and gooseberries are removed in the immediate vicinity of the pine area. The disease not being present in Oregon, the best prevent its entrance and rapid spread is the eradication of the most susceptible host, the cultivated black current. The work of eradication is practically complete in Marion county. About 1100 bushes have been removed. The crew of men doing this work have Oats met with the heartiest coopera-


