DEFENSE WINS WRANGLE OVER INSANITY PLEA

(Continued from page 1) chair, crossed his fingers over his vest and for the next four and a half hours of court session held that pose while the lawyers wrangled.

From the outset Mr. Crowe argued that the plea of guilty had effectively barred from the proceedings any offer of insanity as a legal defense.

Judge Caverly pointed out that the defense had given no indication of what they expected to prove by Dr. White's testimony.

The judge observed there were degrees of insanity recognized in Illinois as well as degrees of murder, but the state disputed this, saying that when a man is insane he cannot distinguish between right and wrong, but if he can so distinguish, he is thoroughly sane in a legal sense.

Authorities Requested Again the judge assured the prosecution that this aspect of the situation would not be allowed to get into the record, but the state's attorney persisted in offering arguments and the judge called for authorities.

Thomas Marshall, the state's attorney's expert on indictments and other intricacies of the law, was given the floor. Hour after hour he read the court records of Colorado, Georgia, Mississippi, Pennsylvania, Nebraska and Great Britain.

Clarence S. Darrow, veteran chief counsel for the defense, for the most part stayed out of the argument. Occasionally he injected a quiet remark when he saw an opportunity to send home a legal principle on which the defense contention rested.

"Moral mania" and "moral insanity" were repeated over and over in Mr. Marshall's argument as he maintained that such conditions were synonymous with "moral depravity" and, therefore, not proper subjects for consideration of a court charged with the duty of fixing a punishment for a "heinous crime."

Judge Enters Objection Several times Judge Caverly interrogated the state as to the effect their attitude would have upon the case. Once he pointed out that Mr. Crowe and his assistants had been allowed to introduce testimony by 81 witnesses without hindrance by the defense.

"If I should now rule out all testimony as to mentalty which the defense offers in mitigation," he said, "could I not be subject to review for acting in an arbitrary manner?"

Mr. Crowe and Walter Bachrach got into a colloquy as to the purpose of the defense, the latter again explaining that the intention was only to "show there is a mental deficiency amounting to a disease, which is in itself a mitigating circumstance."

Mr. Crowe went back to his contention that the question of mental deficiency should be decided only by a jury and the court's inquiry went unanswered.

"Who is going to answer for the defense after the state gets through?" Mr. Darrow was asked at adjournment tonight.

"There is nothing to answer," he said. "Not one case they have cited is in point here. Some of them are 75 and 100 years old and besides they quote judges who knew little or nothing about mental deficiencies."

Hot weather and the prospect of long legal conflict caused attorneys for both sides to petition Judge Caverly to reduce the court day to four hours, divided equally between morning and afternoon sessions. He agreed when they pointed out that their labors extended through many others hours of study in preparation for the proceedings in open court. The five-hour sessions have lasted through seven court days.

Projections were made tonight that at least one more week would be required to finish the hearing. Judge Caverly has intimated that he will take several additional days in which to consider his decision as to punishment for Leopold and Loeb.
