PRUNE BREAD RECIPE. 1 pt. liquid (milk or water) or 2 cakes compressed yeast. About 3 qts. sifted bread flour. 4 t melted shortening. 4 t salt. 4 t sugar. 1 pound prunes.

When the milk in the cup is lukewarm, break in the yeast and add 1 t sugar. Add yeast to batter. Beat well; add enough more flour so that the dough may be put out on the board and kneaded.

Put the dough in the greased mixing bowl, grease the top of the dough to keep it from crustling over. Cover the bowl with a clean cloth and get the bowl where it will keep warm.

When the dough has doubled in bulk, knead it down again and let rise a second time until double in bulk. Form into loaves, let rise until nearly double in bulk and bake from 45 minutes to one hour depending on the size of the loaf.
