FAIR IS HEAVY

Financial Receipts Little Short of 1823 and Expenses Not as Great

The total paid attendance at the Oregon state fair, which closed here yesterday, was 69,200, or 9000 more than last year when 79,200 paid admissions at the gates. Cash receipts of the fair this year were \$99,312, against \$102,372 last year.

Expenses of the fair just closed are estimated at about \$8000 less than last year, and the fair board believes a larger balance will be left than a year ago when all accounts are squared up. Season tickets sold this year aggregated \$1516.75 against \$1574.50 last year. Single admission tickets this year brought in \$31,177, and last year \$35,285. Tickets to the grandstand this year brought was \$6797. From the horse show \$5262 was received this year against \$6688 last year.

From the concessions the board realized this year \$8143 and last year \$7366.06. The carnival shows this year brought in \$3061 against \$2747.59 last year.
