

### BLOOD OF STUARTS AND BURNS IN HIS

Lineal Descendant of Line of Scottish Kings Dies at Minto, Oregon

William Henry Burns Stewart (Stuart) was born December 22, 1842, at Springfield, Illinois, and passed away at his home, Minto, Oregon, September 27, 1924.

Mr. Stewart came by ox team with his parents from Illinois, to California, in 1856 where, as a

youth, he became interested in mining operations in the Golden state, and, later, in the state of Nevada. Here he became intimately acquainted with the late Samuel L. Clemens, in the Comstock lode mines, in the early sixties.

Late in 1863, Mr. Stewart came to Oregon, making his home in Marion county to the time of his demise. Always having been a constant and vigorous reader, he was well informed on matters political and historical.

His father, William Stewart, was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, and was a lineal descendant of the family of Scottish kings. His grandmother, on his mother's side, was a relative of the Burns family, of which the Scotch poet was a member.

Mr. Stewart's remains were interred in the IOOF cemetery at Jefferson, Oregon, on Tuesday, Sept. 30.

The following near relatives survive: The widow, formerly Isabelle Anderson; Lancel N. Stewart, a son, of Minto, Oregon; Mrs. Henry Siegmund, of Stayton; Mrs. Alta Leedy, Minto, and Mrs. Bertha Ward of Seattle, Washington.

### Mandamus Demands Vote On Justices in Group

With Dr. C. J. Smith of Port-

land, chairman of the democratic state central committee, named as plaintiff, a mandamus suit was filed in the supreme court yesterday against Sam A. Koser, secretary of state, demanding that the names of the three candidates for the supreme bench to be voted on in the November election be entered on the ballot in a single group.

On the ballot as certified by Secretary of State Koser, Justice Coshov and Judge H. H. Belt of Dallas appear as the democratic and the republican candidates respectively to succeed Justice Lawrence T. Harris, who resigned. Justice Coshov was appointed to the office by the governor, but under the law serves only through the approaching election. The name of Judge Percy R. Kelly of

Albany appears on the ballot as an independent candidate to succeed the late Justice John McCourt. Judge Kelly is a republican, but is running independently because the death of Justice McCourt occurred too late to make it possible for candidates to file with party designation.

It is the opinion of the petitioners for the mandamus that with the three names grouped, and with instructions for the voters to vote for two, Justice Coshov will have a better chance of election than he will with only Judge Belt as his opponent.

### Over \$5000 Netted By Auto Tourist Grounds

With a month to go before the Salem automobile camp grounds are closed for the season, a statement prepared by T. G. Albert, superintendent, indicates that the grounds are now on a self-supporting basis. The grounds were opened for business March 1 and the receipts have been in excess of \$5000.

In the last seven months 5454 tourist parties have registered at the grounds, while last season the total was 4535, or nearly 1000 less than this season to date.

On the basis of four persons to every automobile, this would mean over 21,000 visitors in the city this tourist season.
