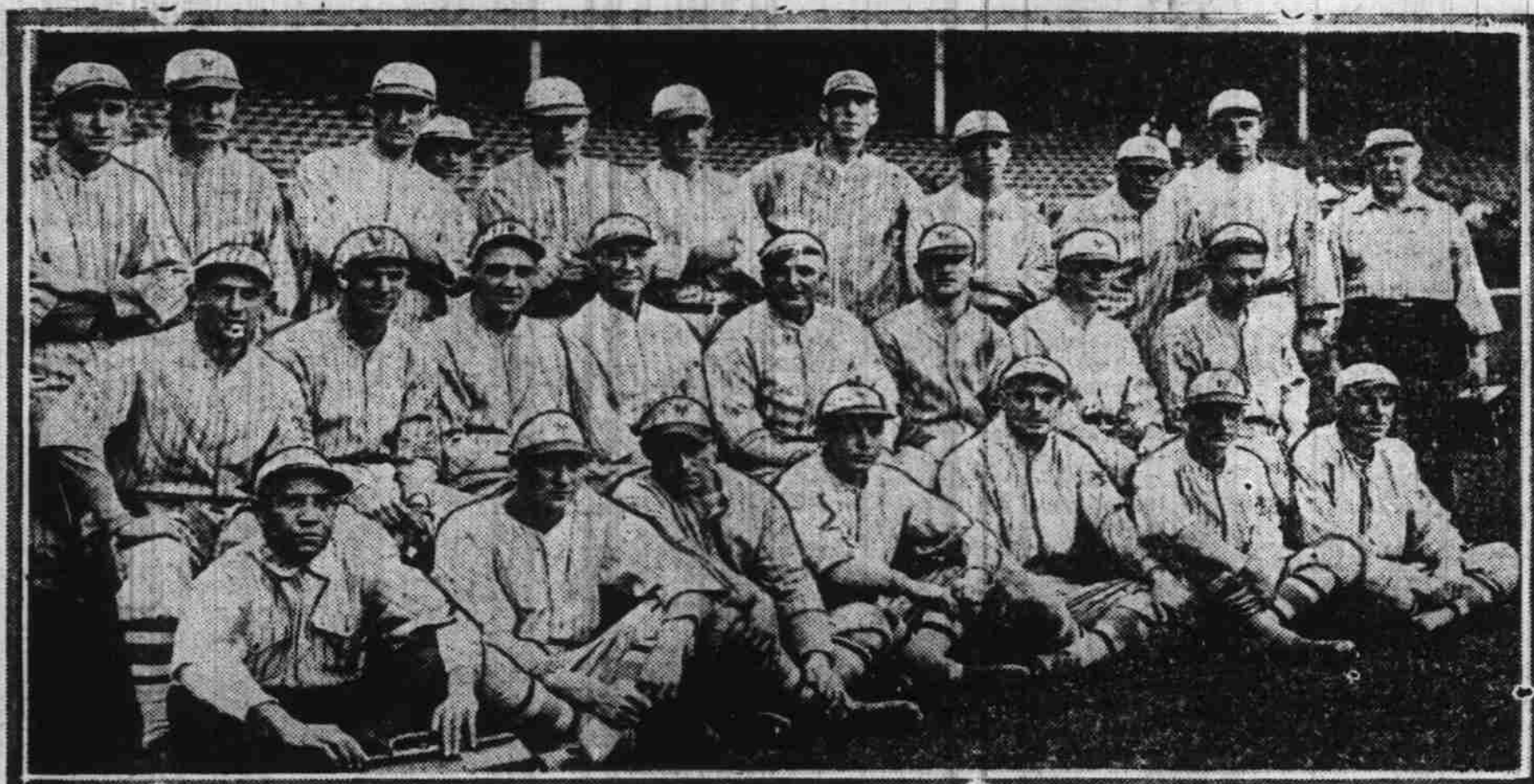
Oakland 9; Sacramento 6. OAKLAND, Oct. 6.—Oakland won the fourth game of the series here today 9 to 6 from Sacramento.
