Nineteen fires in Oregon during October represented a property loss of \$59,150, according to a report issued from the state fire marshal's office Monday. The fires occured throughout the state and are exclusive of Portland. Klamath county reported the heaviest loss, with 15,000 bushels of wheat valued at \$1 a bushel. Astoria was second, with \$9500

and a large Josephine county dwelling third with \$8000. Two dwelling were destroyed in Polk county at a loss of \$3000 each. Silverton reported two very small fires, the total damage being placed at \$50.

Of the 19 fires, 4 were from undetermined causes; 3 from explosions; matches and careless smokers, overheated stoves and causes not given contributed 2 each. The other six fires were caused by a coke oven, incendiary, defective wiring, lightning, defective flue and sparks from a tractor. 

May Have Another Mill The New York paper intimates that the big operations of the people connected with the Dominion

Linens will be at Lockport, New

York, where they have a foothold But it is known that they are looking to Salem. These same people own the patents of the Ves-Tsot flax pulling machine, like the 13 owned in the Salem district. They make these machines at Toronto. Canada. They belong to the same crowd that controls the Dominion Linens and its subsidiar-

Col. W. B. Bartram, well known to many Salem people, represented his company in placing and starting the flax pulling machines. He was here last year, and this year he spent the whole harvest season here.

People connected with his companies are ready to subscribe a considerable sum towards the building of a spinning and weaving plant in Salem. How far Mr. Bartram and his people have progressed in this project is not definitely known here; but it is understood that they fully intend to push it, and be ready to take over all the surplus flax fiber that they can get in Oregon.

The Third Mill The third spinning mill projected for Salem is the one to be owned and operated by B. C. Miles and his associates. Mr. Miles has a contract with the state for the fiber, and he expects to have the spinning mill in operation by the first of next July.

The Fourth Factory. The fourth proposed mill at Salem is one projected by Dr. Deimel for the weaving and the making of linen mesh cloth for underwear and hospital towels, after a patented process.
