EUGENE, Or., Nov. 20.—When the Oregon Aggies and the University of Oregon football teams clash on Bell field in Corvallis Saturday, the Oregon Aggies will have had the advantage of a two weeks' rest period. Oregon on the other hand has been going straight through a period of seven hard contests without a breathing spell.

The game will be the 28th between the rivals. Of the 27 games played Oregon has won 16 and the Aggies 5. Six resulted in tie scores.

BEARCATS TO MEET PACIFIC SATURDAY
