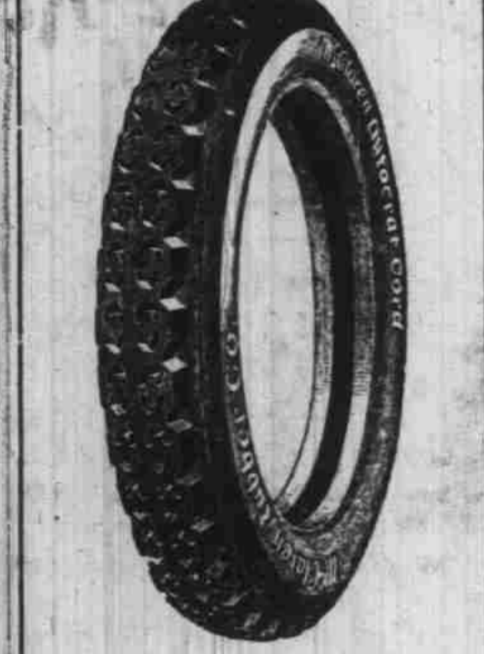

TROJAN TEAM TAKES GAME

Southern California Defeats Missouri Champions By Score of 20-7

COLISEUM, Los Angeles, Dec. 25.—(By the AP.)—The Trojan football gladiators of the University of Southern California had Tiger meat in addition to turkey today. In the second inter-sectional gridiron conflict played on the Pacific coast this year the Trojans defeated the Bengal gridiron men of the University of Missouri, champions of the Missouri valley conference, 20 to 7.

Outplayed by the middlewestern team throughout the first half the Southern Californians clinched victory in the third period. Forward passes gave the Trojans two of the three touchdowns they scored in this period. The Missouri touchdown came in the last 30 seconds of play when Tuttle recovered a fumble 20 yards from the Trojan goal and dashed across the last white line.

The Missouri team, rated by the "experts" as being two touchdowns weaker than the Trojans, showed unexpected strength in the first period. They played heady, clean football and displayed a daring attack. They came within scoring distance twice during the first two periods.

In the third period the Trojans ran wild. Runs, most of them by squat, square-built Lefebvre, took the oval to the seven-yard line. A minute later Lefebvre followed his three-man interference across the goal line.

Missouri kicked off, and after a poor start, the Southern Californians again began to travel. With the ball on Missouri's 42-yard line Chief Newman, an Indian, threw a pass to right end Badgro, who continued 24 yards to a touchdown.

Rural Mail Carriers Find Sympathy in Heart of Well-known Salem Writer

SUGAR FROM JERUSALEM ARTICHOKE IS STILL IN THE EXPERIMENTAL STAGE

"Up to the Present Time the Whole Question of Manufacturing of Levulose From Artichokes Must Be Considered Strictly Experimental," Says Chief of U. S. Bureau of Plant Industry

(The following, from the editorial columns of the Portland Journal, is a sample of articles that have appeared lately in many newspapers of the United States— including the original Associated Press news item sent out from Washington and printed in The Statesman and other Associated Press papers):

"From Artichokes
"Sugar can be produced in the northwest at a cost of 4 cents a pound from common tuber artichokes, according to Dr. W. J. Spillman of the United States department of agriculture.

"Artichoke sugar, according to the federal authority, is 50 per cent sweeter than cane sugar. It dissolves in cold water as readily. It can be used for all the purposes for which cane sugar is employed. It can be produced more cheaply than either beet sugar or cane sugar.

"The sweetening element of the sugar now in common use is sucrose. That in artichokes is levulose. The problem has been to crystallize levulose. Laboratory experiments at Washington, D. C., resulted in the discovery that artichoke sugar must have a temperature of 26 to 50 degrees in which to crystallize. Cane sugar crystallizes at high temperatures.

"The importance of the Spillman announcement to the northwest, dependent on the confirmation afforded by actual experience, is that the artichokes can be grown in this region easily and abundantly. All that is required by way of storage is to cover them with half a foot of earth. Provided that, they are not affected by freezing.
