An open meeting at the church at 7:45 o'clock will complete the program for the day.

NIGHT-TRAINING SCHOOL PLANNED
 Kimball College Inaugurates System to Educate Teachers and Leaders

The faculty of Kimball School of Theology is arranging for an evening training school for teachers and those preparing to be teachers in the Sunday schools of Salem. Any person of senior high school age or older, regardless of denominational preferences will be welcome to enroll in this school. The class sessions are to be held in the Kimball building Monday and Wednesday evenings beginning January 19, and closing February 25.

Four classes will be held each evening: From 7:15 to 8:05 p. m. Dr. E. S. Hammond will offer a course in the study of the intermediate boy and girl. At the same hour Dr. D. W. Eldred will teach a course covering the Old Testament. At 8:10 Prof. W. H.

Hartwig will lead a class in the principles of teaching, and at the same hour a general course on the New Testament will be taught by Dr. J. D. McCormick. All of these subjects will be presented with the view of practical helplessness.

A registration fee of \$2 will be charged. For an extra dollar the student may take two courses. Bulletins describing the courses offered are to be distributed at all Salem churches Sunday January 11. People from nearby rural communities are invited to take advantage of this evening school for training leaders in religious education.
