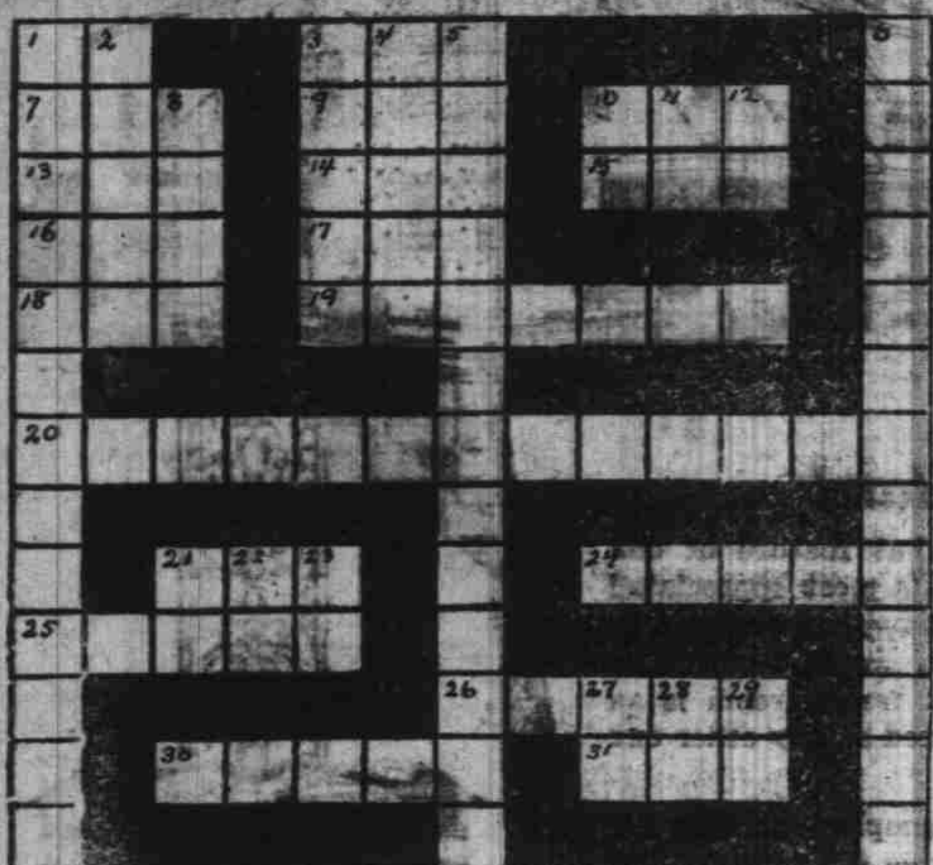


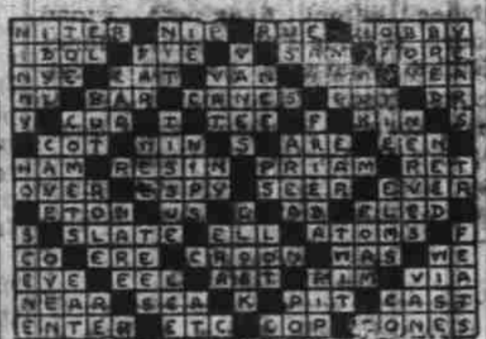

BIG LUMBER SHIPMENT

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 13.—Lumber shipments from the Columbia river for the year 1922 amounted to 922,623,194 feet. This means that more than an average of 3,000,000 feet of lumber was shipped from the Columbia river each working day.

Shipments this month amounted to 93,320,000 feet which is the record month to date. September 1924 was the next largest month showing shipments of 90,830,000 feet.
