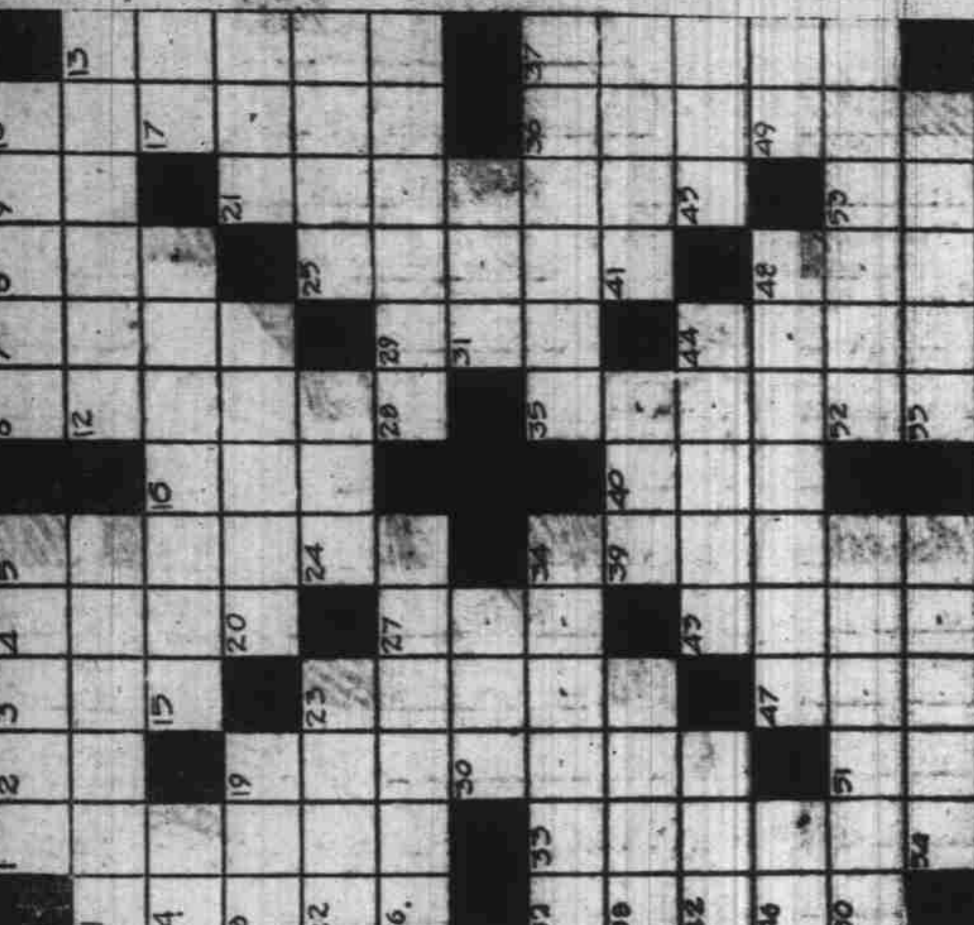

AVIATION FUTURE PLANS DISCUSSED

Commercial Flying Is Described as Backbone of Industry By Experts

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17.—Petitions from chambers of commerce and suggestions from members of Congress for extensions of the air mail service are being received daily by the post-office department, the requests being based upon representations by business men who believe they see in the air mail the greatest single promise for the saving of time and the appearance in recent years.

Such a board should be clothed with authority to advise with the various counties as to enforcement problems, to investigate those officers who are neglectful of duty, and when the results of such investigation warrant to set in motion the legal machinery to remove such delinquents. Likewise the board ought to have power to extend to the incorporated cities, to the end that they may advise and assist the peace officers therein, with attendance of authority of investigation. In addition the board ought to be given authority to employ and utilize, in the assistance of the peace officers of any county, upon emergency, trained detectives.

Recent debates brought out that during the last two years and ten months the government planes have flown in excess of 5,000,000 miles and have carried 2,050 tons of mail with a loss of 125 pounds. Or estimated in number of pieces, only 5,000 of the 180,000,000 letters transported were lost. Since July 1, when the postoffice department began its night flying, through mail from coast to coast has been carried in an average elapsed time of 33 hours.

Americans Good Patrons Of Paris-London Air Route

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17.—Americans develop a penchant for flying when they get to Europe, according to Lieut. John P. Van Zandt, of the United States air service, who has just returned from a 6,000 mile air trip through Europe studying development of commercial aeronautics.

During the summer weeks 1,000 passengers leave London by plane for Paris, and the majority are American tourists. More than 35,000 Americans have flown between the British and French capitals, saving from four to eight hours on the trip, and avoiding the turbulent English Channel which has caused many a traveler to lose his love for the sea.
