## OREGON WINS FROM WSC; SCORE 30-24

**Game Is Fast Throughout; U. of O. Is Now First in Conference Standing**

EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 9.—The University of Oregon defeated Washington State college here tonight by the score of 30 to 24. The game was fast throughout, and close all the way. At the end of the first half Oregon had but a two point lead, the score standing 18 to 16.

The lemon-yellow, by its victory tonight and the defeat of Washington by Idaho in Seattle, is now in first place in both the northwest and Pacific coast conferences.

Washington State started the scoring, Morgan dropping a field goal from one side of the floor. Hobson of Oregon followed with one a few minutes later. The two teams stayed neck and neck the remainder of the four periods. Hobson was high point man with 12 counters, all from the field.

## COUNTY OFFICERS' SALARIES FIXED

**Local Measure One of Four Introduced in House Session Monday**

A bill was introduced in the house yesterday by the Marion county delegation, fixing the salaries of county officials. Under the provisions of the measure the county judge will receive \$1500 a year; the county commissioners \$4 a day while engaged in county business and the county treasurer \$1500.

The county clerk will receive \$1800, with not to exceed \$4800 additional to pay for duties during the year. The recorder of conveyances will receive \$1500, a slight increase, with \$2400 allowed for deputy salaries; the county assessor \$1800, with \$2400 allowed for deputies and the county school superintendent \$1500, with travel expenses approved by the county court. A clerk or deputy is also authorized, the salary to be fixed by the county court. The sheriff will receive \$2000 and not to exceed \$3000 for deputy salaries. A fee of 10 cents a mile for serving processes in civil cases is also allowed.

Other bills introduced yesterday were HB No. 415, by Coffey, a substitute for HB No. 129, relating to fees collected by county clerks and courts in counties of more than 50,000 population; HB No. 416, by Mott, to provide for assessment and taxation of denuded forest land, and HB No. 418, a substitute for HB No. 17, by Cowell, regulating the sale, manufacture and repair of bedding.

for breath or whose vitality had ebbed low would breathe faster. Pneumonia patients breathe at the rate of 40 times a minute. "Because of the regularity of the vibratory sounds I am confident that noises we heard were made by the electric light bulb raising and lowering with Collins' breathing. "We tried in various ways to reproduce the same sound and were unsuccessful. The sound came with clock-like rhythm, and I am confident it was respiration we heard." H. T. Carmichael, in charge of the sinking of the shaft to Collins, said that he had knocked on the wires in the cave with stones and had moved the wires but received no sound similar to that accepted as Collins' breathing. Dropping of water was tried, he said, but did not produce the same effect.

"They treated me fairly good while I was there. But the system is wrong. The prison commissioners are gentlemen, but they cannot see everything that goes on."

Joe Furrey was a member of the confidence gang which fleeced Frank Norfleet, Hale county sheriff, of \$45,000. Norfleet resigned his office and pursued members of the gang all over the country, finally landing all of them in prison.

"Furey was given only one meal a week," said Dr. Boaz. "For fear the man would starve to death, I slipped him scraps of food. Man Stamped to Death "I saw him a few hours before

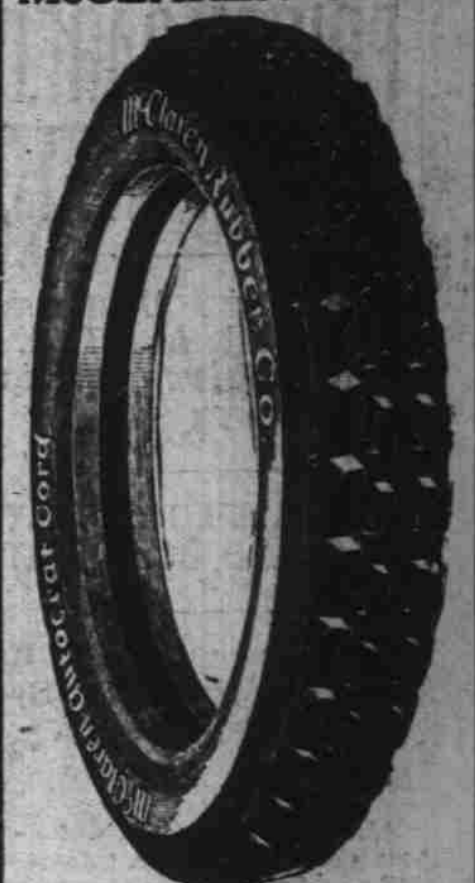
he died. A guard plunged him head first into a bath tub of cold water and when he was almost drowned he dragged him out and beat him over the head with a club, then threw him on the floor and stamped him to death." Dr. Boaz said Dillard had bled to death when a doctor in charge plunged an aspirating needle into his side, ostensibly to draw fluid from the lungs, but that arterial blood flowed from the needle, which throbbled with Dillard's heart beats. ### CHAMP SWIMMERS PERFORM THURSDAY

Will Be Seen in YMCA Tank During Afternoon; Also Sing in Glee Club

Four young men who hold the world's championship in the distances of 160 and 850 yards, who are appearing here February 12 with the Northwestern university glee club, will give an exhibition swim at the YMCA tank at 3:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon.

Stopping at Salt Lake City on the way to the coast, the singer-swimmers took the University of Utah aquatics into camp in a dual meet by a heavy score, winning every event and taking first and second places in the 40-yard, 110-yard and 220-yard free style events. Two of the swimmers, Howell and Breyer, were on the American Olympic team.

Three inter-mountain collegiate records were broken in this meet and the world's inter-collegiate record in the 40-yard free style event was equaled. The touring swimmers annexed the relay event with little trouble while Corbett, also of Northwestern, took the diving contest. The fourth member of the team is Manowitz, who

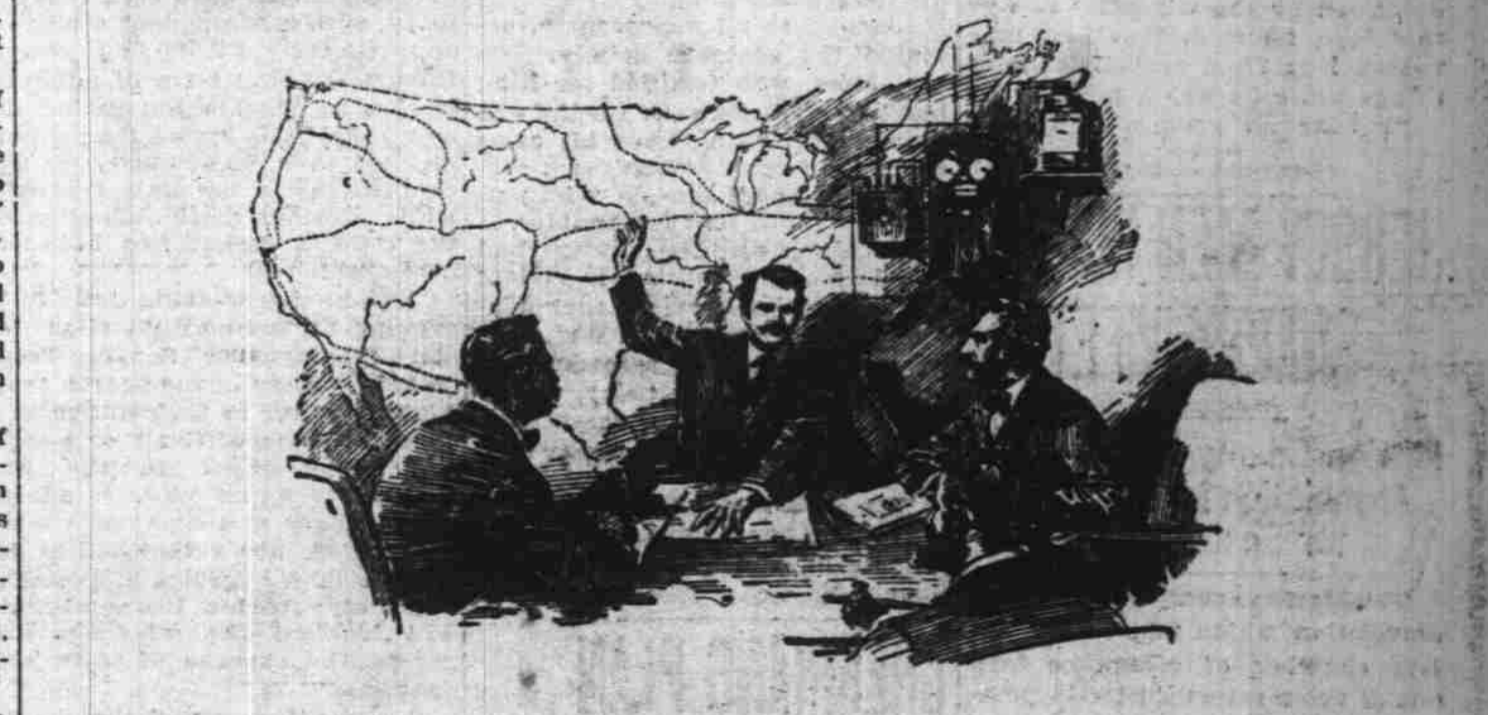
