SLUGGISH GAME OFFERED FANS

Washington State college won a sluggish basketball game from Willamette university in the Willamette gymnasium last night by the one sided score of 61 to 22. Neither team displayed much in-

terest except in spurts which quickly ended. WSC started off with a rush, annexing 10 points before the Willamette team succeeded in making a couple of tallies on Fasnacht's free throws. The half ended 31 to 12 in favor of WSC.

Nolan, right forward for the visitors, was the high point man with 21 points. Morgan, WSC right guard, played a good game and ranked next to Nolan in scoring with 13 points. Fasnacht, while not at his best, for the locals, played consistent ball and led

his teammates in point getting with 12 points.

that rate, they have thirty or forty in which to lay by a fortune. When they do retire again to private practice, the fact that they have served on the bench is the best possible advertising they could have. I am not in favor of increasing the salary at this time, due to the many emergency appropriations we are obliged to handle."

"At any rate, we must remember that the state has never asked the justices to apply for their

positions. The election has only been over a few months, and those gentlemen know at the time what the salary would be. Serving on the bench of the supreme court has never crippled a man's activity, nor caused one to retire in penury."

Senator Tooze, chairman of the ways and means committee, voiced protest at what he termed "railroad legislation," and scored the senate in a stinging rebuke against their aspersions on the committee. "The men in the ways and means committee are not short-sighted, nor stingy," Senator Tooze declared. "But we are mindful of the great need for economy, when we see before us appropriations asking for nearly \$10,000,000, with only \$5,000,000 with which to work on."

In the final vote on the passage of the bill, those casting an affirmative ballot were Senators Banks, Butler, Carsner, Clark, Corbett, Davis, Dennis, Eddy, Hall, Hare, Johnson, Klepper, Magladry, Rit-

mer, Staples, Strayer, Upton and Moser. Those voting against the bill were Senators Beal, Brown, Dunn, Fisk, Garland, Joseph, Kinney, La-follette, Taylor, Tooze and Zimmerman.
