HB 456, by Russell and Shrock—Substitute for HB 363, permitting fishing for shad in Willamette slough between May 10 and June 10.

HB 457, by food and dairy committee—Substitute for HB 356, relating to manufacture, sale and distribution of butter and oleomargarine and providing for licensing thereof.

HB 458, by food and dairy committee—Substitute for HB 340, pertaining to regulations of the sale of eggs.

HB 459, by Douglas county delegation—Closing a certain estuary known as Rainbow Basin, within city of Reedsport and Port of Umpqua.

HB 460, by Multnomah delegation—Substitute for HB 79, pertaining to election of county school superintendents.
