## SENATE VOTES SALARY RAISE

running for their offices during the election, what their salaries were to be. Senator Toose declared, "They made campaigns up and down the state, and they said nothing about wanting an increased salary. I have opposed persistently as well as consistently any salary raise which is not left up to the people for final vote, and I shall oppose this one."

Senator Staples spoke against the increase, declaring that here was a good place to stop. "This means a great deal to a state that is almost bankrupt," Senator Staples said, "and it will not end now. The tide is just starting to come in. Soon we will be deluged with bills for salary increases and appropriations."

Senator Miller took the floor in favor of the passage of the bill. "I am ordinarily opposed to salary increases," he stated, "but I do not apologize for my stand on this one. These three state officers are now receiving the same salaries that they received twenty years ago. All wages, salaries, and everything else have increased since then. I believe their salaries should be raised at least \$900; at any rate, we must endeavor to make it commensurate with the duties and dignity of their offices."

## THE CAPITAL CITY CREAMERY JOINS UP

Is Member of Newly Organized North Pacific Cooperative Creameries

AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Feb. 1.—The Capital City Cooperative Creamery of Salem is a member of the newly organized North Pacific Cooperative Creameries. The organization of the association was initiated through the efforts of the Portland chamber of commerce, the dairy and food commissioner of Oregon, and the Oregon Agricultural college.

The immediate goal of the association is to standardize and raise the quality of the butter made by its members with the ultimate object of finding a larger outside market for Oregon butter. Other creameries now belonging to the association include: Eugene Farmers, Eugene; St. Paul, St. Paul; Hood River, Hood River; Lower Columbia, Astoria; and Raven Dairy company, Portland.

W. H. Dancy, member of the city council in addressing the Chamber of Commerce yesterday at the open forum, stated that Salem needed a bridge program at the present time.

"There are over 50 bridges in the city, which are wearing out and eventually must be replaced. Under the budget for this year only \$4500 was set aside for repairs and replacements. This sum, however, is not sufficient to replace any of the present bridges. Additional money cannot be secured under the present 6-per cent limitation of the city charter. Consequently some bridge program is needed."

"I think the millage tax is the best program, because it will allow about \$20,000 to be raised each year. In this manner, we will be allowed to solve some of the difficult bridge problems that are before us. It would allow us to go ahead on the South Commercial street bridge. You are aware of the condition of the structure at this moment. Some action must be taken. Under the millage tax, the city would be allowed to construct one or two bridges each year."

"The appointment of Williams' successor will be made shortly. Virgil Earl, director of athletics will recommend a coach to the executive council of the associated students. As Coach Dick Smith already has the football men out for spring practice, he will require an aide."

Under present arrangements the Prince of Wales, who returned to London tonight to fulfill some engagements, will act for the king at the two levees at Buckingham palace on March 10 and 19.
