

FRANKLIN HIGH WILL COMPETE

Portland Championship Team Accepts Invitation to Play in Tournament

The Portland winner will enter the state tournament to be held here March 12, 13 and 14. The Oregon State High School Athletic association has definitely decided to invite Franklin high, the winner of the Portland series, and the invitation has been accepted, according to information given by Coach Guy L. Rathbun. While the Willamette officials have nothing to do with the selection of teams, the statement is official, coming from the Oregon high school board.

The Willamette gym has been rearranged to accommodate the large crowd expected, all available space not taken by the bleachers is to be arranged as to be available for standing room. At present a total of over 2,000 spectators can be accommodated.

All districts have not yet reported as to their representative team, however; Salem high will represent district No. 7, having met and defeated all other contenders from this section. The Salem record includes two wins over Silverton, two over Independence, two over Dallas and two over West Lynn. In the outside competition Salem lost but to two teams of high school standing—Franklin high of Portland and Ashland high. Neither team, however, can be considered as a sure winner over Salem at the tourney, as the Franklin team won by but a single point, 15-14. The comparative scores of Ashland and Salem show the two teams to be evenly matched.

Other teams who will enter are Pendleton, from district 3; either McMinnville or Cloverdale from district 9, and Medford, winner of last year.

A district tournament will be held in the Marshfield district, on March 6 and 7 to decide the winner of that section.

A new system of placing the teams will be used this year. Six teams will be given the bye on Thursday, which will leave eight teams for the rest of the series. By this method no team will be given any advantage in time to rest at the end of the series. The drawing for places will take place in State Superintendent of Schools Churchill's office and the results will be made known Monday.

All competing teams will be expected to abide by the same rules set down by the board of control. One very important change from last year is that eight men may be used during the tournament instead of seven. This is expected to be a decided advantage over the system of last year as enough substitutions can be made to prevent an overstrain on any one man.

The tournament has been well supported by the various clubs and business organizations of the city, and as all arrangements are well under way for taking care of the

visiting teams the tournament this year is expected to be one of the best given in several years.

Northwest are to be visited. J. H. Gerom of Hamburg called on Robert C. Paulus on business

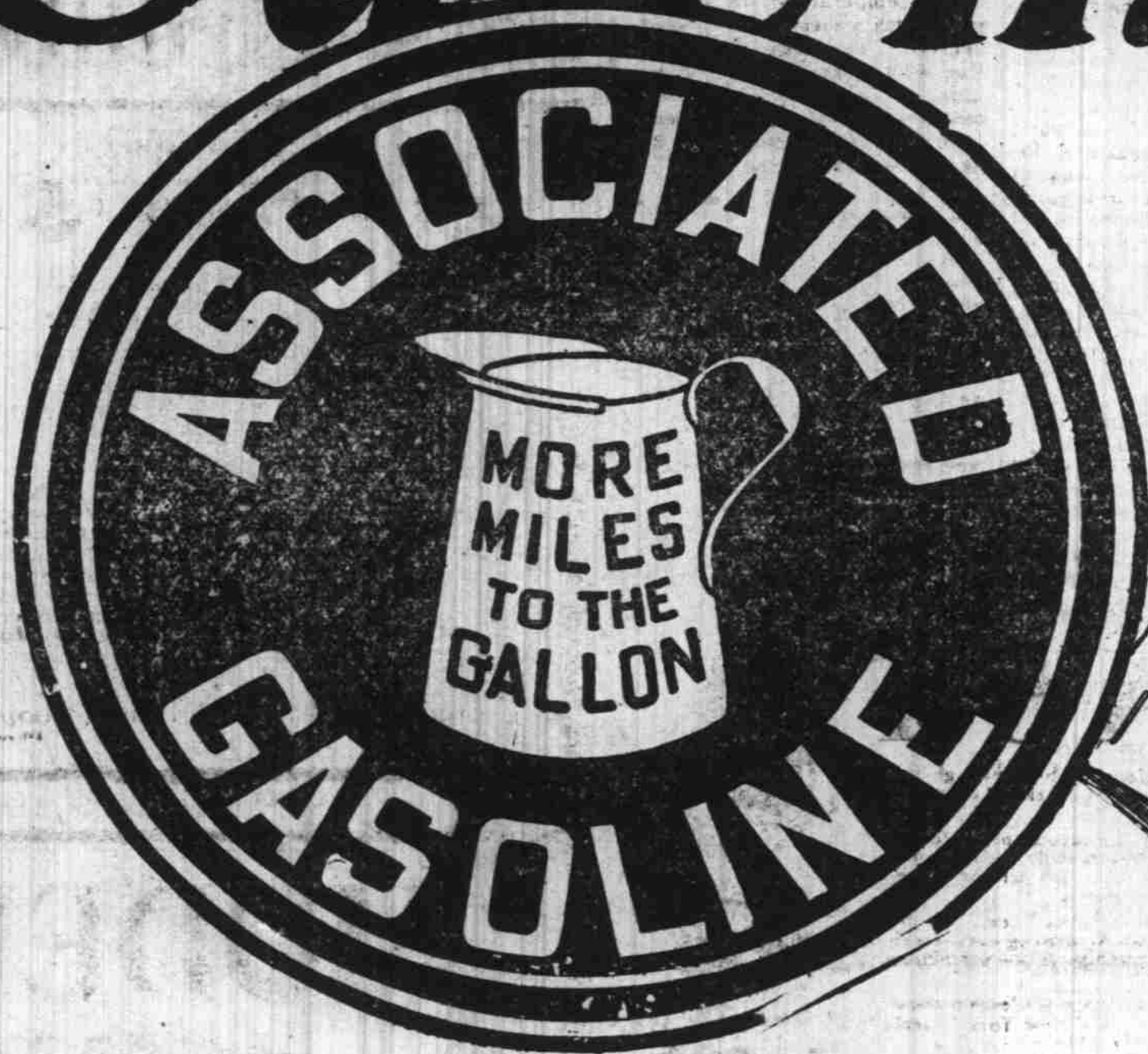
