Wheat fell 8 1/4 c a bushel from the day's top figures and closed excited. \$1.64 1/2 to \$1.165 for May delivery and \$1.45 % for July, the bottom prices reached 4 1/2 c to 6 % under Saturday's close. Rye finished at BEFORE YOU LEAVE YOUR HOME 3% to 4%c net loss, corn 3%c to 4e down, oats 1 5-8c to 2 1-8c off and provisions varying from 7c decline to 2c advance.

It was hardly more than half an hour before the end of the day that the situation arose which demoralized the wheat market. Speculative sellers were quick to seize the advantage and the smashing of prices which ensued was made worse by the wholesale execution of standing orders to stop losses on the part of the holders unable to unwillingly to maintain ownership beyond definite limits.


