

### CONTRACTOR DIES SUNDAY MORNING

Funeral Services for Clarence Van Patton Held This Afternoon

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon for Clarence Van Patton, Salem pioneer and prominent contractor for the last 25 years. Mr. Van Patton

died at his home Sunday morning at the age of 67 years. He had been in ill health since October, 1923, and last fall was forced to resign from the city council on this account. Mr. Van Patton came here from Kansas in 1890 and some years later entered into a partnership with Ira Erb, continuing with him for 15 years. After the death of his partner Mr. Van Patton continued the firm as Van Patton & Son, taking Cuyler Van Patton as his partner. ### Owner of Dog Is Arrested And Brought Before Judge

R. L. Gray was fined \$5 in the police court because he let his dog run at large. He is the second man to be brought before the local court for the violation of the city ordinance designed to keep the animals from running at large.

The city ordinance, which was recently revised and passed by the city council provides that dogs must be kept on a leash while on the streets of the city. Exception is made, however, for animals that are being used in driving stock within the city limits. The animal must be actually employed at the time the exception is made. The police are making a strenuous effort in getting the law enforced and have adopted the principle of arresting the owner of the dogs instead of arresting and impounding the animals.

### A NEW CAST IRON FURNACE ON TAPIS

Four Hundred of Them Have Been Sold, Before the First One Is Made

W. W. Rosebraugh is working on patterns for a new cast iron furnace. They will be ready the 15th to the 20th of April. And already a Portland firm has bought 400 of the furnaces, before the first one has been turned out. Mr. Rosebraugh has been making steel furnaces for several years, but cast iron furnaces will be a new line. This same Portland concern that has bought 400 of the new cast iron furnaces yet to be manufactured will use at least 200 of the steel furnaces of the Rosebraugh manufacture during the present year.

W. W. Rosebraugh, furnace and boiler maker, is the way the name appears in the telephone directory. But Mr. Rosebraugh makes a number of articles that are, fashioned from steel and iron and other metals. He is just now shipping four 55 foot smokestacks to the Cobbs & Mitchell people for their new sawmill addition at Vale. He has made the smokestack for the new Benton hotel at Corvallis; 55 feet high, and a large one in diameter. He has made 15 1200 gallon

tanks for the state highway department, and may make 24 more. Mr. Rosebraugh has kept a force of 15 men all winter, and there will soon be 30 or more. They did twice as much work in February of this year as in any former February.

The Rosebraugh factory is at Seventeenth and Oak streets, and it adds materially to the activities of that section of Salem. That is a section, by the way, that has grown wonderfully in the past few years.
